Supp. 2018, Section 1600), which relates to highway and 12 bridge signage; requiring Department of Transportation to incur signage costs; deleting 1.3 qualifications for memorial signage; amending Section 12, Chapter 372, O.S.L. 2013, as amended by Section 14 1, Chapter 61, O.S.L. 2015 (69 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 1600.1), which relates to highway and bridge 15 dedications; eliminating qualifications for highway and bridge dedications; and providing an effective 16 date. 17 18 19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 20 SECTION 1. 69 O.S. 2011, Section 1600, as AMENDATORY 21 last amended by Section 3, Chapter 311, O.S.L. 2017 (69 O.S. Supp. 22 2018, Section 1600), is amended to read as follows: 23 Section 1600. A. The cost associated with signage related to 24 the naming of highways and bridges on the state highway system shall

1	be paid by the group sponsoring or requesting the sign. The
2	provisions of this section shall not apply to the naming of highways
3	and bridges on the state highway system designed to honor:
4	1. Members of the United States Armed Forces who were killed
5	while participating in contingency operations;
6	2. Members of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol fallen in the
7	performance of their duties;
8	3. Peace officers certified pursuant to Section 3311 of Title
9	70 of the Oklahoma Statutes fallen in the performance of their
10	duties; and
11	4. First responders as defined by Section 1-2506.1 of Title 63
12	of the Oklahoma Statutes fallen in the performance of their duties.
13	B. As used in this section, the term "contingency operation"
14	means a military operation that:
15	1. Is designated by the Secretary of Defense as an operation in
16	which members of the armed forces are or may become involved in
17	military actions, operations or hostilities against an enemy of the
18	United States or against an opposing military force; or
19	2. Results in the call or order to, or retention on, active
20	duty of members of the uniformed services under Section 688,
21	12301(a), 12302, 12304, 12304a, 12305 or 12406 of Title 10 U.S.C.,
22	Chapter 15 of Title 10 U.S.C., Section 712 of Title 14 U.S.C., or
23	any other provision of law during a war or during a national
24	emergency declared by the President or Congress.

C. The Department of Transportation shall promulgate rules
establishing a procedure to assess and collect the cost of the
signs. The assessment of cost shall include the cost of the initial
erection of the sign as well as the potential replacement or
reconstruction of the sign. The cost of these signs shall be based
on an average of the cost of signs erected during the preceding
fiscal year, as reported by the Department of Transportation.
SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Section 12, Chapter 372, O.S.L.
2013, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 61, O.S.L. 2015 (69 O.S.
Supp. 2018, Section 1600.1), is amended to read as follows:
Section 1600.1 Highways, bridges, and other facilities which
are part of the state highway system may be considered for
dedication in honor of individuals deserving of commendation for
their active involvement in the project or for outstanding service
to the nation, this state, or their community. Persons proposed to
be so honored shall have been deceased not less than three (3) years
prior to consideration. The provisions of this section shall not
apply to the naming of highways and bridges on the state highway
system designed to honor members of the United States Armed Forces,
members of law enforcement or firefighters fallen in the performance
of their duties. The provisions of this section shall also not
apply to the naming of highways and bridges on the state highway
system designed to honor Medal of Honor recipients both living and

1	deceased. Proposals for the dedication of state highway facilities
2	should specifically state the accomplishments upon which the
3	proposal is based .
4	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
