  - D. The Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services shall promulgate rules to implement the provisions of the Oklahoma Diversionary Court Funding Program Act.
  - SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 474 of Title 22, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services to be designated the "Oklahoma Diversionary Court Funding Program Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of appropriations made by the Legislature, which are based on a formula calculated by One Dollar (\$1.00) per inmate per day for every day the inmate is in a private prison in this state during the previous fiscal year. All monies accruing to such fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services for the purpose of providing diversionary court programs and services, as provided in the Oklahoma
