17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

18 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-101, as
19 last amended by Section 5, Chapter 47, 1st Extraordinary Session,
20 O.S.L. 2023 (47 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section 6-101), is amended to read
21 as follows:

22 Section 6-101. A. No person, except those hereinafter
23 expressly exempted in Sections 6-102 and 6-102.1 of this title,
24 shall operate any motor vehicle upon a highway in this state unless

1 the person has a valid Oklahoma driver license for the class of
2 vehicle being operated under the provisions of this title. No
3 person shall be permitted to possess more than one valid license at
4 any time, except as provided in paragraph 4 of subsection F of this
5 section.

6 B. 1. No person shall operate a Class A commercial motor
7 vehicle unless the person is eighteen (18) years of age or older and
8 holds a valid Class A commercial license, except as provided in
9 paragraph 5 of this subsection and subsection F of this section.
10 Any person holding a valid Class A commercial license shall be
11 permitted to operate motor vehicles in Classes A, B, C and D, except
12 as provided for in paragraph 4 of this subsection.

13 2. No person shall operate a Class B commercial motor vehicle
14 unless the person is eighteen (18) years of age or older and holds a
15 valid Class B commercial license, except as provided in paragraph 5
16 of subsection F of this section. Any person holding a valid Class B
17 commercial license shall be permitted to operate motor vehicles in
18 Classes B, C and D, except as provided for in paragraph 4 of this
19 subsection.

20 3. No person shall operate a Class C commercial motor vehicle
21 unless the person is eighteen (18) years of age or older and holds a
22 valid Class C commercial license, except as provided in subsection F
23 of this section. Any person holding a valid Class C commercial
24

1 license shall be permitted to operate motor vehicles in Classes C
2 and D, except as provided for in paragraph 4 of this subsection.

3 4. No person under twenty-one (21) years of age shall be
4 licensed to operate any motor vehicle which is required to be
5 placarded for hazardous materials pursuant to 49 C.F.R., Part 172,
6 subpart F, except as provided in subsection F of this section;
7 provided, a person eighteen (18) years of age or older may be
8 licensed to operate a farm vehicle which is required to be placarded
9 for hazardous materials pursuant to 49 C.F.R., Part 172, subpart F,
10 except as provided in subsection F of this section.

11 5. A person at least seventeen (17) years of age who
12 successfully completes all examinations required by law may be
13 issued by Service Oklahoma:

14 a. a restricted Class A commercial license which shall
15 grant to the licensee the privilege to operate a Class
16 A or Class B commercial motor vehicle for harvest
17 purposes or a Class D motor vehicle, or

18 b. a restricted Class B commercial license which shall
19 grant to the licensee the privilege to operate a Class
20 B commercial motor vehicle for harvest purposes or a
21 Class D motor vehicle.

22 6. No person shall operate a Class D motor vehicle unless the
23 person is sixteen (16) years of age or older and holds a valid Class
24 D license, except as provided for in Section 6-102 or 6-105 of this

1 title. Any person holding a valid Class D license shall be
2 permitted to operate motor vehicles in Class D only.

3 C. Any person issued a driver license pursuant to this section
4 may exercise the privilege thereby granted upon all streets and
5 highways in this state.

6 D. No person shall operate a motorcycle or motor-driven cycle
7 without having a valid Class A, B, C or D license with a motorcycle
8 endorsement. Except as otherwise provided by law, any new applicant
9 for an original driver license shall be required to successfully
10 complete a written examination, vision examination and driving
11 examination for a motorcycle as prescribed by the Department of
12 Public Safety, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma, and a certified
13 state-approved motorcycle basic rider course approved by the
14 Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma, if the applicant
15 is seventeen (17) years of age or younger to be eligible for a
16 motorcycle endorsement thereon. The written examination and driving
17 examination for a motorcycle shall be waived by Service Oklahoma
18 upon verification that the person has successfully completed a
19 certified Motorcycle Safety Foundation rider course approved by the
20 Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma.

21 E. Except as otherwise provided by law, any person who lawfully
22 possesses a valid Oklahoma driver license which is eligible for
23 renewal shall be required to successfully complete a written
24 examination, vision examination and driving examination for a

1 motorcycle as prescribed by the Department, in conjunction with
2 Service Oklahoma, and a certified state-approved motorcycle basic
3 rider course approved by the Department, in conjunction with Service
4 Oklahoma, if the person is seventeen (17) years of age or younger to
5 be eligible for a motorcycle endorsement. The written examination
6 and driving examination for a motorcycle shall be waived by Service
7 Oklahoma upon verification that the person has successfully
8 completed a certified Motorcycle Safety Foundation rider course
9 approved by the Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma.

10 F. 1. Any person eighteen (18) years of age or older may apply
11 for a restricted Class A, B or C commercial learner permit. Service
12 Oklahoma, after the applicant has passed all parts of the
13 examination for a Class D license and has successfully passed all
14 parts of the examination for a Class A, B or C commercial license
15 other than the driving examination, may issue to the applicant a
16 commercial learner permit which shall entitle the person having
17 immediate lawful possession of the commercial learner permit and a
18 valid Oklahoma driver license or provisional driver license pursuant
19 to Section 6-212 of this title to operate a Class A, B or C
20 commercial motor vehicle upon the public highways solely for the
21 purpose of behind-the-wheel training in accordance with rules
22 promulgated by the Department.

23 2. This commercial learner permit shall be issued for a period
24 as provided in Section 6-115 of this title of one hundred eighty

1 (180) days, which may be renewed one time for an additional one
2 hundred eighty (180) days; provided, such commercial learner permit
3 may be suspended, revoked, canceled, denied or disqualified at the
4 discretion of the Department, with notice to Service Oklahoma, for
5 violation of the restrictions, for failing to give the required or
6 correct information on the application or for violation of any
7 traffic laws of this state pertaining to the operation of a motor
8 vehicle. Except as otherwise provided, the lawful possessor of a
9 commercial learner permit who has been issued a commercial learner
10 permit for a minimum of fourteen (14) days may have the restriction
11 requiring an accompanying driver removed by satisfactorily
12 completing a driver's examination; provided, the removal of a
13 restriction shall not authorize the operation of a Class A, B or C
14 commercial motor vehicle if such operation is otherwise prohibited
15 by law.

16 3. No person shall apply for and Service Oklahoma shall not
17 issue an original Class A, B or C driver license until the person
18 has been issued a commercial learner permit and held the permit for
19 at least fourteen (14) days. Any person who currently holds a Class
20 B or C license and who wishes to apply for another class of
21 commercial driver license shall be required to apply for a
22 commercial learner permit and to hold the permit for at least
23 fourteen (14) days before applying for the Class A or B license, as
24 applicable. Any person who currently holds a Class A, B or C

1 license and who wishes to add an endorsement or remove a restriction
2 for which a skills examination is required shall be required to
3 apply for a commercial learner permit and to hold the permit for at
4 least fourteen (14) days before applying for the endorsement.

5 4. A commercial learner permit shall be issued by Service
6 Oklahoma as a separate and unique document which shall be valid only
7 in conjunction with a valid Oklahoma driver license or provisional
8 driver license pursuant to Section 6-212 of this title, both of
9 which shall be in the possession of the person to whom they have
10 been issued whenever that person is operating a commercial motor
11 vehicle as provided in this subsection.

12 5. After one renewal of a commercial learner permit, as
13 provided in paragraph 2 of this subsection, a commercial permit
14 shall not be renewed again. Any person who has held a commercial
15 learner permit for the initial issuance period and one renewal
16 period shall not be eligible for and Service Oklahoma shall not
17 issue another renewal of the permit; provided, the person may
18 reapply for a new commercial learner permit, as provided for in this
19 subsection.

20 G. 1. For purposes of this title:

21 a. "REAL ID Compliant Driver License" or "Identification
22 Card" means a driver license or identification card
23 issued by this state that has been certified by the
24 United States Department of Homeland Security (USDHS)

1 as compliant with the requirements of the REAL ID Act
2 of 2005, Public Law No. 109-13. A REAL ID Compliant
3 Driver License or Identification Card and the process
4 through which it is issued incorporate a variety of
5 security measures designed to protect the integrity
6 and trustworthiness of the license or card. A REAL ID
7 Compliant Driver License or Identification Card will
8 be clearly marked on the face indicating that it is a
9 compliant document, and

10 b. "REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License" or
11 "Identification Card" means a driver license or
12 identification card issued by this state that has not
13 been certified by the United States Department of
14 Homeland Security (USDHS) as being compliant with the
15 requirements of the REAL ID Act of 2005. A REAL ID
16 Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card
17 will be clearly marked on the face indicating that it
18 is not compliant with the federal REAL ID Act of 2005
19 and is not acceptable for official federal purposes.
20 The driver license or identification card will have a
21 unique design or color indicator that clearly
22 distinguishes it from a compliant license or card.

23 2. Original Driver License and Identification Card Issuance:
24

- 1 a. Application for an original REAL ID Compliant or REAL
2 ID Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card
3 shall be made to Service Oklahoma.
- 4 b. Service Oklahoma employees shall perform all document
5 recognition and other requirements needed for approval
6 of an original REAL ID Compliant or REAL ID
7 Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card
8 application.
- 9 c. Upon approval of an original REAL ID Compliant or REAL
10 ID Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card
11 application, the applicant may take the approved
12 application document to a licensed operator to receive
13 a temporary driver license or identification card.
- 14 d. The licensed operator shall process the approved REAL
15 ID Compliant or REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License or
16 Identification Card application and upon payment shall
17 provide the applicant a temporary driver license or
18 identification card. A temporary driver license or
19 identification card shall afford the holder the
20 privileges otherwise granted by the specific class of
21 driver license or identification card for the period
22 of time listed on the temporary driver license or
23 identification card or the period of time prior to the
24 applicant receiving a REAL ID Compliant or REAL ID

1 Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card,
2 whichever time period is shorter.

3 3. REAL ID Compliant Driver License and Identification Card

4 Renewal and Replacement:

- 5 a. Application for renewal or replacement of a REAL ID
6 Compliant Driver License or Identification Card may be
7 made to Service Oklahoma or to a licensed operator;
8 provided, such licensed operator is authorized to
9 process application for REAL ID Compliant Driver
10 Licenses and Identification Cards. A licensed
11 operator may process the voluntary downgrade of a REAL
12 ID Compliant Commercial Driver License to any lower
13 class license upon request of the licensee; provided,
14 no additional endorsements or restrictions are placed
15 on the license.
- 16 b. Service Oklahoma employees or authorized licensed
17 operators shall perform all document recognition and
18 other requirements needed for approval of a renewal or
19 replacement REAL ID Compliant Driver License or
20 Identification Card application.
- 21 c. Upon approval of a renewal or replacement REAL ID
22 Compliant Driver License or Identification Card
23 application, the applicant may receive a temporary
24

1 driver license or identification card from Service
2 Oklahoma or an authorized licensed operator.

3 d. A temporary driver license or identification card
4 acquired under the provisions of this paragraph shall
5 afford the holder the privileges otherwise granted by
6 the specific class of driver license or identification
7 card being renewed or replaced for the period of time
8 listed on the temporary driver license or
9 identification card or the period of time prior to the
10 applicant receiving a REAL ID Compliant Driver License
11 or Identification Card, whichever time period is
12 shorter.

13 e. For purposes of this title, an application for a REAL
14 ID Compliant Driver License or Identification Card by
15 an individual with a valid Oklahoma-issued driver
16 license or identification card shall be considered a
17 renewal of a REAL ID Compliant Driver License or
18 Identification Card.

19 4. REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License and Identification Card

20 Renewal and Replacement:

21 a. Application for renewal or replacement of a REAL ID
22 Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card may
23 be made to Service Oklahoma or to a licensed operator.
24 A licensed operator may process the voluntary

1 downgrade of a REAL ID Noncompliant Commercial Driver
2 License to any lower class license upon request of the
3 licensee; provided, no additional endorsements or
4 restrictions are added to the license.

5 b. Service Oklahoma employees or licensed operators shall
6 perform all document recognition and other
7 requirements needed for approval of a renewal or
8 replacement REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License or
9 Identification Card application.

10 c. Upon approval of a renewal or replacement REAL ID
11 Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card
12 application, the applicant may receive a temporary
13 driver license or identification card from Service
14 Oklahoma or a licensed operator.

15 d. A temporary driver license or identification card
16 acquired under the provisions of this paragraph shall
17 afford the holder the privileges otherwise granted by
18 the specific class of driver license or identification
19 card being renewed or replaced for the period of time
20 listed on the temporary driver license or
21 identification card or the period of time prior to the
22 applicant receiving a REAL ID Noncompliant Driver
23 License or Identification Card, whichever time period
24 is shorter.

1 H. 1. The fee charged for an approved application for an
2 original Oklahoma REAL ID Compliant or REAL ID Noncompliant Driver
3 License or an approved application for the addition of an
4 endorsement to a current valid Oklahoma REAL ID Compliant or REAL ID
5 Noncompliant Driver License shall be assessed in accordance with the
6 following schedule:

18 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 1104 of this
19 title, all monies collected from the fees charged for Class A, B and
20 C commercial licenses pursuant to the provisions of this subsection
21 shall be deposited in the General Revenue Fund of this state.

22 I. The fee charged for any failed examination shall be Four
23 Dollars (\$4.00) for any license classification. Notwithstanding the
24 provisions of Section 1104 of this title, all monies collected from

1 such examination fees pursuant to the provisions of this subsection
2 shall be deposited in the General Revenue Fund of this state.

3 J. In addition to any fee charged pursuant to the provisions of
4 subsection H of this section, the fee charged for the issuance or
5 renewal of a REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License shall be in
6 accordance with the following schedule; provided, that any applicant
7 who has a CDL Learner Permit shall be charged only the replacement
8 fee for the issuance of the license:

20 K. In addition to any fee charged pursuant to the provisions of
21 subsection H of this section, the fee charged for the issuance or
22 renewal of a REAL ID Compliant Driver License shall be in accordance
23 with the following schedule; provided, that any applicant who has a
24

1 CDL Learner Permit shall be charged only the replacement fee for the
2 issuance of the license:

18 L. A commercial learner permit may be renewed one time for a
19 period of one hundred eighty (180) days. The cost for the renewed
20 permit shall be the same as for the original permit.

21 M. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 1104 of this
22 title, of each fee charged pursuant to the provisions of subsections
23 J, K and L of this section:

24

1 1. Five Dollars and fifty cents (\$5.50) of a 4-year license or
2 Eleven Dollars (\$11.00) of an 8-year license shall be deposited to
3 the Trauma Care Assistance Revolving Fund created in Section 1-
4 2530.9 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

5 2. Six Dollars and seventy-five cents (\$6.75) of a 4-year
6 license or Thirteen Dollars and fifty cents (\$13.50) of an 8-year
7 license shall be deposited to the Department of Public Safety
8 Computer Imaging System Revolving Fund to be used solely for the
9 purpose of administration and maintenance of the computerized
10 imaging system of the Department through October 31, 2022.

11 Beginning November 1, 2022, Six Dollars and seventy-five cents
12 (\$6.75) of a 4-year license or Thirteen Dollars and fifty cents
13 (\$13.50) of an 8-year license shall be deposited to the Service
14 Oklahoma Computer Imaging System Revolving Fund to be used solely
15 for the purpose of administration and maintenance of the
16 computerized imaging system of Service Oklahoma;

17 3. Ten Dollars (\$10.00) of a 4-year license or Twenty Dollars
18 (\$20.00) of an 8-year license shall be deposited to the Department
19 of Public Safety Revolving Fund for all original or renewal
20 issuances of licenses through October 31, 2022. Beginning November
21 1, 2022, Ten Dollars (\$10.00) of a 4-year license or Twenty Dollars
22 (\$20.00) of an 8-year license shall be deposited to the Service
23 Oklahoma Revolving Fund for all original or renewal issuances of
24 licenses; and

1 4. Five Dollars (\$5.00) of a 4-year license or Six Dollars
2 (\$6.00) of an 8-year license shall be deposited to the State Public
3 Safety Fund created in Section 2-147 of this title.

4 N. All original and renewal driver licenses shall expire as
5 provided in Section 6-115 of this title.

6 O. 1. Through May 31, 2025, any person sixty-two (62) to
7 sixty-four (64) years of age during the calendar year of issuance or
8 renewal of a Class D license or motorcycle endorsement shall be
9 charged the following prorated fee:

14 2. Any person sixty-five (65) years of age or older during the
15 calendar year of issuance or renewal of a Class D license or
16 motorcycle endorsement shall not be charged a fee.

17 P. No person who has been honorably discharged from active
18 service in any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States or
19 Oklahoma National Guard and who has been certified by the United
20 States Department of Veterans Affairs, its successor or the Armed
21 Forces of the United States to be a disabled veteran in receipt of
22 compensation at the one-hundred-percent rate for a permanent
23 disability sustained through military action or accident resulting
24 from disease contracted while in such active service and registered

1 with the veterans registry created by the Oklahoma Department of
2 Veterans Affairs shall be charged a fee for the issuance,
3 replacement or renewal of an Oklahoma driver license; provided, that
4 if a veteran has been previously exempt from a fee pursuant to this
5 subsection, no registration with the veterans registry shall be
6 required.

7 Q. In accordance with the provisions of subsection G of this
8 section, Service Oklahoma is authorized to promulgate rules for the
9 issuance and renewal of driver licenses authorized pursuant to the
10 provisions of Sections 6-101 through 6-309 of this title; provided,
11 that no such rules applicable to the issuance or renewal of REAL ID
12 Noncompliant Driver Licenses shall create more stringent standards
13 than such rules applicable as of January 1, 2017, unless directly
14 related to a specific change in statutory law concerning standards
15 for REAL ID Noncompliant Driver Licenses. Applications, upon forms
16 approved by Service Oklahoma, for such licenses shall be handled, in
17 accordance with the provisions of subsection G of this section, by
18 the licensed operator; provided, Service Oklahoma is authorized to
19 assume these duties in any county of this state. Each licensed
20 operator accepting applications for driver licenses shall receive
21 Six Dollars (\$6.00) for a 4-year REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License
22 or Twelve Dollars (\$12.00) for an 8-year REAL ID Noncompliant Driver
23 License or Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for a 4-year REAL ID Compliant
24 Driver License or Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for an 8-year REAL ID

1 Compliant Driver License to be deducted from the total collected for
2 each license or renewal application accepted through June 30, 2023.
3 Beginning July 1, 2022, and ending on June 30, 2023, each motor
4 license agent or licensed operator accepting applications for driver
5 licenses for individuals over the age of sixty-five (65) years or
6 for applications for drivers pursuant to subsection P of this
7 section shall receive Six Dollars (\$6.00) for a 4-year driver
8 license or Twelve Dollars (\$12.00) for an 8-year driver license to
9 be deducted daily by the motor license agent or licensed operator
10 receipts. Beginning July 1, 2023, these fees shall be retained by
11 the licensed operator pursuant to subsection E of Section 1141.1 of
12 this title. The fees received by the licensed operator, authorized
13 by this subsection, shall be used for operating expenses. The
14 amount retained pursuant to this subsection shall not be retained by
15 any state agency. The fees received by the licensed operator,
16 authorized by this subsection, shall be used for operating expenses.
17 For purposes of this subsection, "licensed operator" shall mean an
18 individual who obtains a license from the Service Oklahoma Operator
19 Board to operate a designated Service Oklahoma location and offers
20 third-party fulfillment of designated services to be rendered by
21 Service Oklahoma.

22 R. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 1104 of this title
23 and subsection Q of this section and except as provided in
24 subsections H and M of this section, the first Sixty Thousand

1 Dollars (\$60,000.00) of all monies collected pursuant to this
2 section shall be paid by the Oklahoma Tax Commission to the State
3 Treasurer to be deposited in the General Revenue Fund of the State
4 Treasury.

5 The next Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) of monies
6 collected pursuant to this section shall be paid by the Tax
7 Commission to the State Treasurer to be deposited each fiscal year
8 under the provisions of this section to the credit of the Department
9 of Public Safety Restricted Revolving Fund for the purpose of the
10 Oklahoma Law Enforcement Telecommunications System. All other
11 monies collected in excess of Five Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars
12 (\$560,000.00) each fiscal year shall be apportioned as provided in
13 Section 1104 of this title, except as otherwise provided in this
14 section.

15 S. Service Oklahoma shall retain the images displayed on
16 licenses and identification cards issued pursuant to the provisions
17 of Sections 6-101 through 6-309 of this title which may be used
18 only:

19 1. By a law enforcement agency for purposes of criminal
20 investigations, missing person investigations or any law enforcement
21 purpose which is deemed necessary by the Commissioner of Public
22 Safety;

23 2. By the driver licensing agency of another state for its
24 official purpose; and

1 3. As provided in Section 2-110 of this title.

2 All agencies approved by the Oklahoma Law Enforcement
3 Telecommunications System (OLETS) or the National Law Enforcement
4 Telecommunications System (NLETS) to receive photographs or
5 computerized images may obtain them through OLETS or through NLETS.
6 Photographs or computerized images may be obtained by law
7 enforcement one inquiry at a time.

8 The computer system and related equipment acquired for this
9 purpose must conform to industry standards for interoperability and
10 open architecture. The Department of Public Safety may promulgate
11 rules to implement the provisions of this subsection.

12 T. No person may hold more than one state-issued or territory-
13 issued REAL ID Compliant Driver License or REAL ID Compliant
14 Identification Card from Oklahoma or any other state or territory.
15 Service Oklahoma shall not issue a REAL ID Compliant Driver License
16 to a person who has been previously issued a REAL ID Compliant
17 Driver License or REAL ID Compliant Identification Card until such
18 license or identification card has been surrendered to Service
19 Oklahoma by the applicant. Service Oklahoma may promulgate rules
20 related to the issuance of replacement REAL ID Compliant Driver
21 Licenses in the event of loss or theft.

22 U. Beginning May 24, 2021, and ending on June 30, 2023, in
23 addition to the amounts provided in subsection Q of this section, a
24 licensed operator shall receive Five Dollars (\$5.00) for each

1 processed application for a REAL ID Compliant 4-year Driver License
2 and Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for each processed application for a REAL
3 ID Compliant 8-year Driver License. Any additional amounts provided
4 pursuant to this subsection shall not be retained by Service
5 Oklahoma.

6 V. 1. No later than November 1, 2025, all credentials,
7 including REAL ID Compliant and REAL ID Noncompliant driver licenses
8 and identification cards, processed in this state by Service
9 Oklahoma or a licensed operator shall be printed primarily within
10 the boundaries of this state. In the event of an emergency or if
11 not economically feasible and practicable, Service Oklahoma may
12 elect, with notice to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the
13 Oklahoma State Senate, and the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of
14 Representatives, to print the credentials outside the boundaries of
15 this state. Service Oklahoma may promulgate rules to implement the
16 provisions of this subsection.

17 2. An applicant for a credential to be issued by Service
18 Oklahoma, including REAL ID Compliant and REAL ID Noncompliant
19 driver licenses and identification cards may request expedited
20 delivery of the credential. For those electing for expedited
21 delivery, there shall be assessed, in addition to any other fees
22 provided for by law, an expedited delivery fee of Forty Dollars
23 (\$40.00), plus the cost of postage. The expedited delivery shall be
24 deposited to the Service Oklahoma Revolving Fund.

1 3. If necessary to provide adequate secure facilities for the
2 processing and printing of credentials as set forth in this
3 subsection, Service Oklahoma is authorized to purchase real estate
4 including, but not limited to, buildings or units, for no more than
5 appraised value or, in the alternative, the Executive Director of
6 Service Oklahoma is authorized to enter into a lease-purchase
7 agreement for the acquisition of such buildings or units from the
8 person or entity that will develop or build the buildings or units.
9 For the purposes of the purchase or build-out of the new facility,
10 Service Oklahoma is hereby exempted from the requirements of the
11 Public Competitive Bidding Act of 1974 as provided in Sections 101
12 through 139 of Title 61 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Service Oklahoma
13 shall be required to collect multiple bids from qualified
14 contractors for the build-out of new facilities.

15 SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
16 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
17 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
18 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
