AS INTRODUCED
An Act relating to state government; providing for
rates of compensation for on-call state employees; repealing 74 O.S. 2011, Section 840-2.29, which
relates to compensation for on-call classified state employees; providing for codification; and providing
an effective date.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 840-2.31 of Title 74, unless
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
State agencies are authorized to pay employees for the periods
of time when the employee is off work premises, but is required to
remain at, near or able to return to work when called upon. This
shall be known as on-call pay. A state employee shall receive
compensation for the periods of time they are assigned on-call duty
For each day on-call during the normal work week, an employee shall
receive compensation for one (1) regular work hour. For each day
on-call during weekends and on holidays, an employee shall receive
compensation for two (2) regular work hours. This credit shall be

1	in addition to actual hours worked during normal duty hours and
2	actual hours worked during on-call duty. An hour of on-call service
3	shall be considered to be an hour worked during the week for
4	purposes of the Fair Labor Standards Act only to the extent required
5	by federal law.
6	SECTION 2. REPEALER 74 O.S. 2011, Section 840-2.29, is
7	hereby repealed.
8	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
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
