7 An Act relating to state government; stating
8 legislative intent; establishing a batterers
9 intervention and treatment pilot program; providing
10 for limit of enrollees in program; providing
reporting requirements; authorizing inspection visits
by Attorney General; providing for codification; and
providing an effective date.

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13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 18p-6.1 of Title 74, unless
16 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 A. It is the intent of the Legislature to allow for district
18 attorney or judicial approval of a batterers intervention and
19 treatment pilot program, in place of a certified batterers
20 intervention program, to allow for localities to examine innovative
21 ways to address domestic violence.

22 B. A batterers intervention and treatment pilot program may be
23 certified and approved by a district attorney or district judge.
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1 C. A certified batterers intervention and treatment pilot
2 program shall not have more than two hundred fifty (250) active
3 participants enrolled at any given time.

4 D. A certified batterers intervention and treatment pilot
5 program shall issue a quarterly report to the district attorney,
6 district judge and the Attorney General that includes all pertinent
7 data required by the Attorney General for batterers intervention
8 programs certified by the Attorney General.

9 E. A certified batterers intervention and treatment pilot
10 program shall issue an annual report to the Legislature that
11 includes, but is not limited to, completion rates and information
12 included in Subsection D of this section.

13 F. All reports issued by a certified batterers intervention and
14 treatment pilot program shall comply with the collection and
15 confidentiality standards outlined in Section 18p-8 of Title 74 of
16 the Oklahoma Statutes.

17 G. Nothing in this section shall preclude the Attorney General
18 from making inspection visits to a batterers intervention and
19 treatment pilot program.

20 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
