Persons proposed to 9 be so honored shall have been deceased not less than three (3) years 10 prior to consideration. The provisions of this section shall not 11 apply to the naming of highways and bridges on the state highway 12 system designed to honor members of the United States Armed Forces, 13 members of law enforcement or firefighters fallen in the performance 14 of their duties. The provisions of this section shall also not 15 apply to the naming of highways and bridges on the state highway 16 system designed to honor Medal of Honor recipients both living and 17 deceased. Proposals for the dedication of state highway facilities 18 should specifically state the accomplishments upon which the 19 proposal is based. 20 SECTION 14. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
