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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 36 O.S. 2011, Section 6060.11, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 6060.11 A. Subject to the limitations set forth in
16	this section and Sections 6060.12 and 6060.13 of this title, any
17	health benefit plan that is offered, issued, or renewed in this
18	state on or after the effective date of this act shall provide
19	benefits for treatment of severe mental illness.
20	B. Subject to the limitations set forth in this section and
21	Sections 6060.12 and 6060.13 of this title, any health benefit plan
22	offered, issued, or issued for delivery in this state on or after
23	the effective date of this act may provide benefits for other forms
24	of mental health or substance abuse disorder benefits.

1 C. 1. Benefits for mental health disorders, including, but not 2 limited to those required by subsection A of this section, and for substance abuse disorder as provided in subsection B of this section 3 4 shall be equal to benefits for treatment of and shall be subject to 5 the same preauthorization and utilization review mechanisms and 6 other terms and conditions as all other physical diseases and disorders, including, but not limited to: 7 coverage of inpatient hospital services for either 8 a. 9 twenty-six (26) days or the limit for other covered 10 illnesses, whichever is greater, 11 b. coverage of outpatient services, 12 coverage of medication, с. 13 d. maximum lifetime benefits, 14 substance abuse disorders shall be subject to a e. 15 lifetime benefits cap of One Hundred Thousand Dollars 16 (\$100,000.00) for inpatient residential treatment, 17 e. f. copayments, 18 coverage of home health visits, f.g. 19 individual and family deductibles, and g. h. 20 h. i. coinsurance. 21 2. Treatment Except as provided in this section, limitations 22 applicable to mental health or substance abuse disorder benefits 23 shall be no more restrictive than the predominant treatment 24 limitations applied to substantially all medical and surgical

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benefits covered by the plan. There shall be no separate treatment limitations that are applicable only with respect to mental health or substance abuse disorder benefits. The provisions of this section shall not apply to coverage D. provided by a health benefit plan for a small employer. SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019. 57-1-5377 01/05/19 SH
