Supp. 2018, Section 2-103), which relate to the Board of Mental 21 Health and Substance Abuse Services; authorizing Governor to appoint Commissioner; providing for 22 determination of compensation; modifying appointment of members of the Board; authorizing the Legislature 23 to remove the Commissioner from office; specifying 24

vote required for removal; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 43A O.S. 2011, Section 2-101, is 6 amended to read as follows:

Section 2-101. A. 1. There is hereby established in this state a Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services.

- 2. This Department's governing board shall be the Board of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services, and its chief executive officer shall be the Commissioner of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services. The Commissioner shall be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate and shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor and may be removed or replaced without cause. Compensation for the Commissioner shall be determined by the Governor. The Commissioner may be removed from office by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members elected to and constituting each chamber of the Legislature.
- 3. The Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services shall exercise all functions of the state in relation to the administration and operation of all state facilities for the care and treatment of the mentally ill and drug- or alcohol-dependent persons.

1 B. All references in the Oklahoma Statutes to the Department of Mental Health or the Board of Mental Health shall be construed to 2 refer to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse 3 Services or the Board of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services, 4 5 respectively. SECTION 2. 43A O.S. 2011, Section 2-103, as 6 AMENDATORY amended by Section 1, Chapter 280, O.S.L. 2017 (43A O.S. Supp. 2018, 7 Section 2-103), is amended to read as follows: 9 Section 2-103. A. The Board of Mental Health and Substance 10 Abuse Services shall be composed of eleven (11) members, appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate. Each 11 12 term is for a seven-year period and members may be reappointed to subsequent terms. Board members shall meet the following criteria: 13 1. One member, who shall be an allopathic physician licensed to 14 15 practice in this state and appointed from a list containing the names of not less than two allopathic physicians and not less than 16 two psychiatrists submitted to the Governor by the Oklahoma State 17

2. One member shall be an osteopathic physician licensed to practice in this state, appointed from a list containing the names of not less than two osteopathic physicians and not less than two psychiatrists submitted to the Governor by the Oklahoma Osteopathic Association;

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Medical Association:

1	3. One member, who shall be an attorney licensed to practice in
2	this state and shall be appointed from a list of not less than three
3	names submitted to the Governor by the Board of Governors of the
4	Oklahoma Bar Association;
5	4. One member, who shall be a psychologist, licensed to
6	practice in this state, who shall be appointed from a list of not
7	less than three names submitted to the Governor by the Oklahoma
8	State Psychological Association;
9	5. Three members, qualified by education and experience in the
10	area of substance abuse recovery, who shall be appointed from a list
11	of not less than ten names submitted to the Governor by a state
12	association of substance abuse recovery programs or organizations;
13	and
14	6. Four members who shall be citizens of this state, at least
15	one of whom shall be either a current or former consumer of mental
16	health services.
17	B. At least one physician appointed pursuant to paragraph 1 or
18	paragraph 2 of subsection A of this section shall be a psychiatrist
19	certified as a diplomate of the American Board of Psychiatry and
20	Neurology, or as a diplomate of the American Osteopathic Board of
21	Neurology and Psychiatry.
22	C. No person shall be appointed a member of the Board who has
23	been a member of the Legislature of this state within the preceding
24	five (5) years the following nine (9) members:

- 1. Five members appointed by the Governor;
- 2. Two members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and
  - 3. Two members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
- B. 1. Each member shall serve at the pleasure of his or her appointing authority and may be removed or replaced without cause.
- 2. Any member of the Board shall be prohibited from voting on any issue in which the member has a direct financial interest.
- 3. The Commissioner of Mental Health and Substance Abuse

  Services shall be an ex officio member of the Board, but shall be entitled to vote only in case of a tie vote.
- 13 D. C. The Board shall elect from among its members a chair and a vice-chair. The chair may call meetings at any time.
  - E. D. All regularly scheduled meetings of the Board shall be held at the Central Office of the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, unless otherwise scheduled. Six members shall constitute a quorum at any meeting, and all action may be taken by an affirmative vote of the majority of the members present at any such meeting.
  - F. E. The action taken by the Board on any matter, or any document passed by the Board, shall be considered official when such action is placed in writing and signed by the chair or vice-chair.

1	$\frac{G.}{F.}$ The duties of the Board shall pertain to the care,
2	treatment, and hospitalization of persons with mental illness, or
3	alcohol- or drug-dependent persons.
4	H. G. Members of the Board of Mental Health and Substance Abuse
5	Services shall be allowed their necessary travel expenses pursuant
6	to the provisions of the State Travel Reimbursement Act.
7	<del>I.</del> <u>H.</u> Members of the Board of Mental Health and Substance Abuse
8	Services shall be allowed to serve on the State Board of Medical
9	Licensure and Supervision and the State Board of Osteopathic
10	Examiners during members' terms on the Board of Mental Health and
11	Substance Abuse Services.
12	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
13	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
14	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
15	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
