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7	An Act relating to public health and safety; amending 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-1201, which relates to
8	hotels; requiring the State Board of Health to promulgate certain rules regarding tornado safety;
9	and providing an effective date.
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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-1201, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 1-1201. (a) A. It shall be unlawful for any person to
16	operate or maintain a hotel unless he <u>or she</u> shall have first
17	obtained, and holds, a license issued for such purpose by the State
18	Commissioner of Health. Unless otherwise provided by rule by the
19	State Board of Health, each such license shall expire on the 30th
20	day of June next following its issuance, and the Commissioner shall
21	charge and collect therefor an annual fee to be fixed by the Board
22	of Health. The term "hotel" as used in this section shall mean and
23	include any hotel, motel, tourist court, apartment house, rooming
24	house, or other place where sleeping accommodations are furnished,

or offered, for pay for transient guests, if four or more rooms are
available therein for transient guests. This section shall apply to
the operation of a hotel by a state board.

4 The State Board of Health may adopt reasonable (b) B. 5 standards, rules and regulations for hotels as to the following: buildings and appurtenances thereto, including plumbing, ventilation 6 7 and lighting; construction, cleanliness and bactericidal treatment of equipment and utensils; cleanliness and hygiene of personnel; 8 9 toilet facilities; disposal of wastes; water supply; and any other 10 items deemed necessary to safeguard the health, comfort and safety 11 of guests accommodated therein. The Board shall promulgate rules 12 requiring hotels to conspicuously post tornado safety information in 13 every room and common area in the same manner as fire evacuation 14 information. The tornado safety information shall be designed by 15 the Board and posted immediately by all hotels under new 16 construction and by existing hotels as those hotels' safety 17 information is updated. At a minimum, the tornado safety 18 information shall list the county the hotel is in, the hotel's 19 location on a state map, information regarding what a hotel guest 20 should do to stay safe during a tornado and, if applicable, the day 21 and time of community tornado siren testing. 22 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020. 23 24
