12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2021, Section 4-101, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 4-101. Every person who is a qualified elector as
16	defined by In accordance with Section 1 of Article III of the
17	Oklahoma Constitution, only citizens of the United States, over the
18	age of eighteen (18) years, who are bona fide residents of this
19	state shall be entitled to become a registered voter in the precinct
20	of his or her residence, with the following conditions:
21	1. Persons convicted of a felony shall be eligible to register
22	to vote when they have fully served their sentence of court-mandated
23	calendar days, including any term of incarceration, parole or

supervision, or completed a period of probation ordered by any court; and

2. Any person who has been adjudged to be an incapacitated person as such term is defined by Section 1-111 of Title 30 of the Oklahoma Statutes shall be ineligible to register to vote. When such incapacitated person has been adjudged to be no longer incapacitated such person shall be eligible to become a registered voter. The provisions of this paragraph shall not prohibit any person adjudged to be a partially incapacitated person as such term is defined by Section 1-111 of Title 30 of the Oklahoma Statutes from being eligible to register to vote unless the order adjudging the person to be partially incapacitated restricts such person from being eligible to register to vote.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
