## 1 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES - FLOOR VERSION 2 STATE OF OKLAHOMA 3 2nd Session of the 55th Legislature (2016) 4 HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 1016 By: Moore 5 6 7 8 AS INTRODUCED 9 A Concurrent Resolution providing for office space within the State Capitol Building for United States 10 Senators representing the State of Oklahoma; requesting that the United States Senators 11 representing the State of Oklahoma be represented at state budget hearings and perform certain other 12 duties; providing for action by the State Legislature to carry out the provisions of the United States 1.3 Constitution and the Oklahoma Constitution; and directing distribution. 14 15 16 WHEREAS, members of the United States Senate elected from this 17 state represent the interest of the State of Oklahoma at the United 18 States Capitol, being elected solely for that sovereign purpose of 19 representing the State of Oklahoma in the United States Senate; and 20 WHEREAS, United States Senators swear an oath to protect, defend 21 and uphold the United States Constitution; and 22 WHEREAS, the United States Senate is a house of states with the 23 intended purpose of protecting states' rights, with the Senators so

elected having a sovereign duty to their state, its people and elected officials; and

WHEREAS, the United States Senate has an important role in checking the overreach of power by the Legislative, Executive and Judicial Branches of the federal government and the prevention of usurpation of the sovereign rights of states; and

WHEREAS, to protect all states and citizens of this country, including the State of Oklahoma and its citizens, the United States Senate confirms appointment of United States Supreme Court Justices and tries all impeachments to remove said Justices for behavior that does not affirm the United States Constitution; and

WHEREAS, as our state has an interest in determining the constitutionality of federal laws, rules and regulations that may be the subject of cases heard by the United States Supreme Court, the Oklahoma Legislature has a duty to uphold the United States Constitution; and

WHEREAS, in performing this duty, the Oklahoma Legislature needs direct access to our representation at the United States Capitol to express the needs of this state; and

WHEREAS, as our state agencies have a number of interactions with the federal government because of federal laws, rules and regulations, our state needs for our United States Senators to be accessible to fully understand when time and monetary cost of complying with these federal laws, rules and regulations is not an

efficient use of our taxpayers' dollars or is outside the boundaries of constitutional authority; and

WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Legislature believes, as a state, it is imperative that our United States Senators be "at the ready" to defend our state from federal overreach and extra-constitutional intrusion and believes this can best be done at no cost to our United States Senators' operational budgets by the granting of office space in the State Capitol to the Oklahoma United States Senators.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 55TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE

CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the United States Senators representing the State of Oklahoma be offered office space within the State Capitol Building, as deemed appropriate by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

THAT as an appreciable percentage of our state's budget comes from appropriations made by the United States Congress, the Oklahoma Legislature requests that the United States Senators representing the State of Oklahoma be available for the protection of state sovereignty such as being represented at our budget hearings, official events as needed by the Governor, and to take direction from the State Legislature relative to national questions that impact Oklahoma's sovereign rights.

THAT the State Legislature take any other action necessary, to implement the intent and purpose of this resolution, and to see that the Constitution of the United States and the State of Oklahoma are fully carried out. Recognizing that the Seventeenth Amendment did not amend the duties or intent of the United States Senators, nor the Senate, to be a house of states and to serve as a protection for states' rights, only the method of election of Senators was changed and that this resolution is fully in compliance with the United States Constitution.
