1 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES - FLOOR VERSION 2 STATE OF OKLAHOMA 3 1st Session of the 55th Legislature (2015) HOUSE JOINT 4 RESOLUTION 1002 By: Kirby of the House 5 and 6 David of the Senate 7 8 9 AS INTRODUCED 10 A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State 11 to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to Section 3 of 12 Article XXVIII of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma; authorizing wineries to ship wine to 1.3 certain consumers; providing ballot title; and directing filing. 14 15 16 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF THE 17 1ST SESSION OF THE 55TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE: 18 SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for 19 their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law, 20 the following proposed amendment to Section 3 of Article XXVIII of 21 the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma to read as follows: 22 Section 3. A. The Legislature shall enact laws providing for 23 the strict regulation, control, licensing, and taxation of the 24 manufacture, sale, distribution, possession, and transportation of

1	alcoholic beverages, consistent with the provisions of this
2	Amendment. Provided, that any manufacturer, or subsidiary of any
3	manufacturer, who markets his or her product solely through a
4	subsidiary or subsidiaries, a distiller, rectifier, bottler,
5	winemaker, brewer, or importer of alcoholic beverages, bottled or
6	made in a foreign country, either within or without this state,
7	shall be required to sell such brands or kinds of alcoholic
8	beverages to every licensed wholesale distributor who desires to
9	purchase the same, on the same price basis and without
10	discrimination, and shall further be required to sell such beverages
11	only to those distributors licensed as wholesale distributors.
12	Winemakers either within or without this state shall be required to
13	sell wine they produce to every licensed wholesale distributor who
14	desires to purchase the wine, but winemakers shall not be required
15	to sell the wine they produce only to licensed wholesale
16	distributors. Winemakers either within or without this state may
17	sell wine produced at the winery to adult consumers who are at least
18	twenty-one (21) years of age and are physically present on the
19	premises of the winery or at a festival or trade show. <u>Wineries</u>
20	either within or without this state that are licensed by the
21	Oklahoma Alcoholic Beverage Laws Enforcement Commission may receive
22	orders for, sell and ship wine directly to consumers over the age of
23	twenty-one (21) years either within or without this state who have
24	visited the winery in person. Winemakers either within or without

- this state that annually produce no more than ten thousand (10,000) gallons of wine may sell and ship only the wine they produce directly to licensed retail package stores and restaurants in this state; provided, however, that any such winemaker which elects to directly sell its wine to package stores and restaurants shall not also use a licensed wholesale distributor as a means of distribution, and shall be required to sell its wines to every package store and restaurant licensee who desires to purchase the same, as supplies allow, on the same price basis and without discrimination. As used in this section, "restaurant" means an establishment that is licensed to sell alcoholic beverages by the individual drink for on-premises consumption and where food is prepared and sold for immediate consumption on the premises.
- B. Any winemaker within or without this state that annually produces no more than ten thousand (10,000) gallons of wine and elects to directly sell its wine to retail package stores and restaurants in this state must self-distribute the wine using only vehicle(s) owned or leased by the winemaker, and without the use of a common or private contract carrier.
- C. All laws passed by the Legislature under the authority of the Article shall be consistent with this provision. All provisions of this amendment are declared to be interdependent. If any provision of this amendment applicable to winemakers is ruled to be unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, then no

1	winemaker shall be permitted to directly sell its wine to retail
2	package stores or restaurants in this state.
3	SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional
4	amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this resolution shall be in
5	the following form:

8	THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:
9	This measure amends Section 3 of Article 28 of the State
10	Constitution. It would allow wine to be shipped by wineries
11	directly to consumers who have visited the winery. The
12	individuals shipping the wine would need a license.
13	SHALL THE PROPOSAL BE APPROVED?
14	FOR THE PROPOSAL — YES
15	AGAINST THE PROPOSAL - NO
16	SECTION 3. The Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives,
17	immediately after the passage of this resolution, shall prepare and
18	file one copy thereof, including the Ballot Title set forth in
19	SECTION 2 hereof, with the Secretary of State and one copy with the
20	Attorney General.
