9	A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or
10	rejection a proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma by adding a new Section 1A to
11	Article I; clarifying the roles of the state and the federal government concerning commerce; providing
12	ballot title; and directing filing.

14	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF THE
15	1ST SESSION OF THE 56TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
16	SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for
17	their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law,
18	the following proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of
19	Oklahoma by adding a new Section 1A to Article I thereof, to read as
20	follows:
21	The Constitution of the United States provides in Section 8 of
22	Article I that Congress has the power to "Regulate Commerce with
23	foreign Nations, and among the several States, and with the Indian
24	Tribes". The State of Oklahoma as an equal part of the several

states of the Union hereby asserts the right to retain as a state's right the power to regulate commerce not expressly provided for in Section 8 of Article I of the United States Constitution. The people of Oklahoma reserve all power with regard to commerce not inconsistent with the power of the Federal government to prevent interference with commerce with foreign Nations, and among the several States, and with the Indian Tribes; and, further, does not allow the Federal government to compel any person or entity to participate in commerce.

SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this resolution shall be in the following form:

This measure amends the Oklahoma Constitution. It adds a new section in the article dealing with federal relations. It provides that if power to regulate commerce under the Commerce Clause of the United States Constitution is not expressly granted to Congress, the state of Oklahoma retains the right to such regulation and that the people of Oklahoma reserve all power concerning commerce not inconsistent with the special power of the federal government.
