L5	WHEREAS, according to most recent data in 2014, approximately
L 6	2.53 million traumatic brain injury related emergency department
L7	visits occurred, including over 812,000 occurring among children;

L9	WHEREAS, approximately 288,000 traumatic brain injury related
20	hospitalizations occurred, including over 23,000 occurring among
21	children; and
22	WHEREAS, 56,800 traumatic brain injury deaths occurred,
23	including 2,529 occurring among children; and
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WHEREAS, the total number of traumatic brain injury emergency department visits, hospitalizations, and deaths increased by 53% from 2006 to 2014; and

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WHEREAS, unintentional falls, being unintentionally struck by or against an object, and motor vehicle crashes were the most common mechanisms of injury contributing to a traumatic brain injury diagnosis in the emergency department. These three principle mechanisms of injury accounted for 47.9%, 17.1%, and 13.2%, respectively, of all traumatic brain injury related emergency department visits.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 57TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-291.8 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

It is the intent of the Oklahoma Legislature to provide preventative education and other preventative actions concerning traumatic brain injuries. It is also the intent of the Legislature to ensure referral to the appropriate public and private entities and agencies of those individuals suffering from debilitating traumatic brain injuries so that those persons can be rehabilitated to their highest potential. It is the further intent of the Legislature that rehabilitation and preventative education be facilitated through the use of mandatory reporting of traumatic

- 5 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
- 6 | in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-291.9 of Title 63, unless
- 7 | there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- 8 A. There is hereby established within the State Department of
- 9 | Health an "Advisory Council on Traumatic Brain Injury". The Council
- 10 | shall consist of the following seventeen (17) members:
- 11 1. The Commissioner of Health or a designee;
- 12 2. The Director of the Department of Human Services or a
- 13 | designee;
- 3. A representative from the Oklahoma Department of
- 15 | Transportation Highway Safety Division;
- 4. A representative from the Brain Injury Alliance of Oklahoma
- 17 | or similar organization;
- 18 5. A representative from the Oklahoma Neurosurgical Society or
- 19 | similar organization;
- 20 6. Two physicians who are representatives of the Oklahoma State
- 21 | Medical Association and the Oklahoma Osteopathic Association;
- 7. Two professionals who are representatives of different areas
- 23 | within the allied health field;
- 8. One administrator representing acute care facilities;

- 9. One administrator representing rehabilitation programs; and
- 10. Six representatives of the general public who are survivors of a traumatic brain injury or a family member of a survivor of a traumatic brain injury.

- B. 1. Members of the Council shall be appointed by the Governor and shall serve for terms of four (4) years, except that six members shall be initially appointed to terms of two (2) years. The Council shall meet at least two (2) times annually.
- 2. The Council shall select from among its membership a chair and vice-chair and such other officers as the members of the Council deem necessary. A majority of the members of the Council shall constitute a quorum to transact business but no vacancy shall impair the right of the remaining members to perform the duties and responsibilities of the Council. Members of the Council shall not receive a salary but shall be allowed reimbursement for expenses pursuant to the State Travel Reimbursement Act.
 - C. The duties and responsibilities of the Council shall be:
- 1. To provide advice and expertise to the State Department of Health by November 1, 2021, in the preparation, implementation and periodic review of a coordinated rehabilitation system for individuals suffering from traumatic brain injuries in Oklahoma;
- 2. To provide advice and expertise in establishing criteria for assistance to those individuals suffering from traumatic brain injuries;

- 3. To make recommendations in developing materials for preventative education for distribution to public and private entities; and
- 4. To perform additional duties as may be deemed necessary by the State Department of Health, the Department of Human Services and the Department of Transportation Highway Safety Division.
- D. An annual summary of recommendations shall be provided by the Council to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Department of Human Services, the Commissioner of Health and the Department of Transportation Highway Safety Division not later than the tenth legislative day of each session of the Legislature.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-291.10 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. The State Department of Health shall establish and maintain a central registry of persons who die or are hospitalized from traumatic brain injuries.
- 1. Every public and private health and social agency and attending physician shall report to the State Department of Health within seven (7) working days after the identification of any person suffering a traumatic brain injury.

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2. The State Medical Examiner shall report to the State

Department of Health within seven (7) working days any individual who dies as a result of suffering a traumatic brain injury.

- 3. The report shall contain the name, age, residence and the type and extent of the traumatic brain injury and any other additional information as may be deemed necessary by the Department. The report shall be required of all public and private health and social agencies and attending physicians beginning November 1, 2022.
- B. An annual summary of the compiled statistics shall be forwarded to the Advisory Council on Traumatic Brain Injury by November 1 of each year.
- SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-291.11 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Beginning January 1, 2021, the State Department of Health shall conduct an annual survey of nursing homes in the state to determine the number of individuals fifty-five (55) years of age and under who reside in such homes due to traumatic brain injury. The immediate family members and guardians of all individuals identified in such a survey shall be informed about rehabilitation opportunities that exist through public and private entities.

SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-291.12 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
