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8	A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to Section 4 of
9	Article VII-B of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma; modifying provisions related to selection
10	of justices or judges; requiring appointment by Governor; providing for appointment by Chief Justice
11	of the Oklahoma Supreme Court in certain circumstances; requiring confirmation by Oklahoma
12	State Senate; providing ballot title; and directing filing.
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15	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF THE
16	1ST SESSION OF THE 59TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
17	SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for
18	their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law,
19	the following proposed amendment to Section 4 of Article VII-B of
20	the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma to read as follows:
21	Section 4. When a vacancy in any Judicial Office, however
22	arising, occurs or is certain to occur, the Judicial Nominating
23	Commission shall choose and submit to the Governor and the Chief
24	Justice of the Supreme Court three (3) nominees, each of whom has

1	previously notified the Commission in writing that he will serve as
2	a Judicial Officer if appointed. The Governor shall appoint one (1)
3	of the nominees a qualified person to fill the vacancy, but if he
4	fails to do so within sixty (60) days <u>after the vacancy occurs,</u> the
5	Chief Justice of the Supreme Court shall appoint one (1) of the
6	nominees, the appointment to a qualified person and in either case
7	the nominee shall not begin to serve until confirmation of the
8	nomination by a majority vote of the members elected to and
9	constituting the Oklahoma State Senate. After confirmation, the
10	appointment shall be certified by the Secretary of State.
11	SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional
12	amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this resolution shall be in
13	the following form:

16	THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:
17	This measure amends the Oklahoma Constitution. It amends
18	Section 4 of Article 7-B. There is an entity known as the
19	Judicial Nominating Commission. This body makes
20	recommendations for appointment of justices to the appeals
21	courts in Oklahoma which includes the Oklahoma Supreme Court
22	and the Oklahoma Court of Criminal Appeals. This measure would
23	remove the Judicial Nominating Commission from the selection
24	process. The Governor would appoint qualified persons in the

1	event of a vacancy. If the Governor did not act within a
2	certain period of time, the Chief Justice of the Oklahoma
3	Supreme Court would make the appointment instead. All of the
4	appointments regardless of who made them would be subject to
5	confirmation by the Oklahoma State Senate. The confirmation
6	would require a majority vote of the those Senators elected to
7	and constituting the Oklahoma State Senate.

11	SECTION 3. The Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives,
12	immediately after the passage of this resolution, shall prepare and
13	file one copy thereof, including the Ballot Title set forth in
14	SECTION 2 hereof, with the Secretary of State and one copy with the
15	Attorney General.
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
