8	AS INTRODUCED
9	A Resolution requesting Governor Kevin Stitt to enact an amendment that recaptures the costs of providing
10	government services to certain persons.
11

13	WHEREAS, involuntary servitude on U.S. soil was abolished in
14	1865 with enactment of the 13th amendment; and
15	WHEREAS, stipulations in the 1866 treaties with the Chickasaw,
16	Choctaw, Creek, Seminole and Cherokee Nations allowed for the
17	adoption of their freedmen and the granting of citizenship; and
18	WHEREAS, citizenship was granted to all freed slaves within
19	their respective states, cities or towns in 1868 with enactment of
20	the 14th amendment; and
21	WHEREAS, the Oklahoma State Legislature adopted Article 1 of the
22	Oklahoma Constitution in 1907 at the time of statehood which
23	established a federal relation to the U.S. Constitution and forbade

1 the adoption of any laws that were based upon race, color or 2 previous condition of servitude; and

3 WHEREAS, the 1936 Oklahoma State Legislature enacted the 4 Oklahoma Indian Welfare Act which restored the treaty right of 5 Tribal Nations to self-govern matters relating to their respective 6 citizens but failed to deem race-based citizenship stipulations as 7 "unenforceable"; and

8 WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Tribal Gaming Compacts between the 9 Chickasaw, Choctaw, Creek and Seminole Tribes which were enacted in 10 2004 provided for the funding of government services for their 11 citizens giving no regard to these tribes' race-based disregard of 12 Article 1 of the Oklahoma Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the Chickasaw, Choctaw, Creek and Seminole nations pursuant to Tribal Council vote on the basis of race, color or ancestor's previous condition of servitude are unable to grant "full" citizenship rights to persons who otherwise would be granted citizenship pursuant to the 14th amendment of the U.S. Constitution and Article 1 of the Oklahoma Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the government services relating to excluded persons on the basis of race, color or ancestor's previous condition of servitude as provided for in Part 5, Section D of the Chickasaw, Choctaw, Creek and Seminole Nation's Tribal Gaming Compacts are being passed on to Oklahoma taxpayers without repayment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 57TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

THAT the Honorable Governor of the State of Oklahoma, Kevin Stitt, enact the amendment proposed and recapture the cost for providing government services to persons who otherwise by tribal vote cannot be provided such services, the cost of which should otherwise be offset against revenues derived through provisions of their nation's Tribal Gaming Compacts, so that these costs are no longer being passed on to Oklahoma taxpayers without repayment.
