8	A Resolution declaring the month of September of 2018 as Atrial Fibrillation Awareness Month; encouraging
9	partnership with the State Department of Health, medical communities and community-based organizations
10	to raise awareness about atrial fibrillation and stroke.
11	SCIORE.
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14	WHEREAS, according to the Centers for Disease Control and
15	Prevention, atrial fibrillation (AF) is the most common type of
16	irregular heartbeat; and
17	WHEREAS, atrial fibrillation consists of both valvular and
18	nonvalvular atrial fibrillation; and
19	WHEREAS, nonvalvular atrial fibrillation, which makes up
20	approximately 95 percent of AF, is estimated to affect 5.8 million
21	people in the United States; and
22	WHEREAS, those with nonvalvular atrial fibrillation have a risk
23	of stroke that is five times greater, and approximately 15 percent
24	of strokes are due to nonvalvular atrial fibrillation; and

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WHEREAS, nonvalvular atrial fibrillation alone is estimated to cost \$6.65 billion per year, and nearly 75 percent of the costs of nonvalvular atrial fibrillation represent direct and indirect costs associated with hospitalization; and

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WHEREAS, in 2010, Oklahoma had the fourth highest death rate for stroke in the nation, and in 2012 stroke was the fifth leading cause of death in Oklahoma, resulting in 1,881 deaths; and

WHEREAS, according to the Centers for Disease Control, in 2010, the stroke death rate among non-Hispanic blacks was 81 percent higher than the rate among non-Hispanic whites in Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, in 2015, the percentage of adults in Oklahoma who had a history of having a stroke was 3.7 percent; and

WHEREAS, risk factors for atrial fibrillation include high blood pressure, heart failure, diabetes, advanced age, hyperthyroidism, and heart disease; and

WHEREAS, modifiable lifestyle behaviors that can lead to a stroke include physical inactivity, tobacco use, poor diet, and heavy alcohol consumption; and

WHEREAS, atrial fibrillation is a serious health issue deserving attention from state health officials; an increase in community awareness of atrial fibrillation and its complications can improve the likelihood that people with atrial fibrillation will seek the treatment they need before suffering from devastating consequences.

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 56TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE: THAT this body encourages its members and their constituents to partner with the State Department of Health, medical communities, and community-based organizations to raise awareness about the risks posed by atrial fibrillation and stroke, as well as the availability of treatment options.
