A. 1. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, in cooperation with the State Board of Education, shall 14 15 actively encourage the concurrent enrollment in college or university courses of eligible high school students of exceptional 16 ability on high school campuses, on college and university campuses 17 and via online courses. 18 2. The State Regents and State Board shall establish concurrent 19 enrollment requirements with an emphasis on determining course 20 readiness and take all necessary actions to ensure the availability 21 of concurrent enrollment opportunities to students in all Oklahoma 22 23 high schools.

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B. The State Board of Education in cooperation with the
Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall prepare
promotional materials explaining the requirements, features, and
opportunities of concurrent enrollment and shall ensure that the
independent school districts distribute the materials to each
student prior to enrollment for each year of high school.

C. No institution of The Oklahoma State System of Higher 7 Education shall deny enrollment in any course to any otherwise 8 9 qualified eligible high school student, or student of at least 10 thirteen (13) years of age who is receiving high-school-level 11 instruction at home, who meets the requirements of concurrent 12 enrollment, nor shall any independent school district prohibit any 13 student who meets the requirements of concurrent enrollment from participating. 14

D. 1. Each high school senior who meets the eligibility requirements for concurrent enrollment shall be entitled to receive a tuition waiver equivalent to the amount of resident tuition for a maximum of six (6) eighteen (18) credit hours per semester in their senior year.

2. <u>Subject to the high school senior concurrent enrollment</u>
 21 program being fully funded, each high school junior who meets the
 22 eligibility requirements for concurrent enrollment shall be entitled
 23 to receive a tuition waiver equivalent to the amount of resident

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1 tuition for a maximum of nine (9) credit hours in their junior year, 2 subject to the availability of funds.

3 <u>3</u>. Tuition waivers provided pursuant to this section shall be 4 granted without any limitation on the number of waivers granted in 5 any year other than the amount of funds available for the program 6 and the number of eligible applicants. The Oklahoma State Regents 7 for Higher Education shall establish an application process and 8 criteria for prioritizing applicants on the basis of need, 9 timeliness of application, or other factors as determined by the

10 State Regents.

When a student earns college credit through concurrent 11 Ε. 12 enrollment, school districts shall provide academic credit for any concurrently enrolled higher education courses that are correlated 13 with the academic credit awarded by the institution of higher 14 education. Academic credit shall only be transcripted as elective 15 credit if there is no correlation between the concurrent enrollment 16 higher education course and a course provided by the school 17 district. 18

19 <u>F. On or before December 1 of each year, the Oklahoma State</u> 20 <u>Regents for Higher Education shall issue an annual report on the</u> 21 <u>concurrent enrollment program implemented pursuant to this section.</u> 22 <u>The annual report shall include but not be limited to the following</u> 23 <u>information:</u>

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1	1. The number of students participating in concurrent
2	enrollment;
3	2. The number of students participating in concurrent
4	enrollment who received tuition waivers pursuant to subsection D of
5	this section;
6	3. The high school graduation rate of students described in
7	paragraphs 1 and 2 of this subsection; and
8	4. The number of students described in paragraphs 1 and 2 of
9	this subsection who earned an associate's degree or a bachelor's
10	degree at an institution of higher education.
11	The annual report shall be posted on the websites of the
12	Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and the Oklahoma State
13	Department of Education.
14	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2018.
15	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
16	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
17	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
18	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
