The Attorney General, upon application by a 17 district attorney, may make application to a judge of competent 18 jurisdiction for, and such judge may grant in conformity with the 19 Security of Communications Act, an order authorizing the 20 interception of wire, oral or electronic communications by any law 21 enforcement agency of this state or any political subdivision 22 thereof having responsibility for the investigation of the offense 23 as to which the application is made, when such interception may 24

1 provide evidence of acts of biochemical terrorism, terrorism, terrorism hoax, and biochemical assault, as defined in Section 2 1268.1 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the commission of the 3 4 offense of murder, the cultivation or manufacture or distribution of 5 narcotic drugs or other controlled dangerous substances, as defined in the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Act, trafficking in 6 7 illegal drugs, as defined in the Trafficking in Illegal Drugs Act, the trafficking of humans for labor or for commercial $\text{sex}_{\mathcal{T}}$ as 9 defined in Section 748 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the 10 pandering of humans for sex as provided in Section 1081 of Title 21 11 of the Oklahoma Statutes or the prostitution of a child, as defined 12 in Section 1030 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes, child sexual 13 exploitation or permitting child sexual exploitation as defined in Section 843.5 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes, soliciting 14 15 sexual conduct or communication with a minor by use of technology as 16 defined in Section 1040.13a of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and any conspiracy to commit the crimes specifically enumerated in 17 this section. 18
