13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:							
14	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be							
15	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:							
16	A. There is hereby created until December 31, 2019, a task							
17	force to study current law enforcement training arrangements in the							
18	State of Oklahoma. The task force shall investigate, study and							
19	consider the transfer of current structure of the Council on Law							
20	Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET) to the Oklahoma							
21	Department of Career and Technology Education for training of future							
22	law enforcement participants.							
23	B. The task force shall submit a report of its findings and							
24	recommendations by November 30, 2019, to the Governor, the President							

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Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, which shall include, but not be limited to:

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- 1. An evaluation of the current training structure;
- 4 2. The training costs, staffing costs and equipment costs to 5 training at CLEET;
  - 3. How the Career and Technology programs could be utilized in the training of law enforcement; and
    - 4. Recommendations for the transfer of duties.
  - C. The task force shall be comprised of eight (8) members to be appointed as follows:
    - 1. Three members appointed by the Governor as follows:
      - a. a member who is a county sheriff in a county with a population less than thirty thousand (30,000),
      - b. a member who is a police chief of a city with a population of twenty-five thousand (25,000) or less, and
      - c. a member representing municipal law enforcement;
    - 2. Two members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate as follows:
      - a. a member who is a currently elected member of the Senate, and
      - b. a member who is a county sheriff in a county with a population of more than fifty thousand (50,000);

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- 3. Two members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives as follows:
  - a. a member who is a currently elected member of the House of Representatives, and
  - b. a member who is a member of CLEET; and
  - 4. A member appointed by the Board of the Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education.

The Chair of the task force shall be selected by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

- D. A quorum of the task force shall be required to approve any final action of the task force. For purposes of this section, five (5) members shall constitute a quorum.
- E. The task force may meet as often as may be required in order to perform the duties imposed upon it. The Chair shall call the first meeting and all subsequent meetings shall be made at the call of the Chair. The Chair shall set the agenda for all meetings.
- F. The meetings of the task force shall be subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act.
- G. The members of the task force shall receive no compensation or travel reimbursement.
- H. Staff support shall be provided by the Governor's office, the Senate and the House of Representatives.
