Any notation of suspension of the driving privilege of a person for reason of 4 5 nonpayment of a fine shall be removed from the driving record after the person has paid the fine and the driving privilege of the person 6 is reinstated as provided for by law; 7

The Department shall file all collision reports and 18 Β. abstracts of court records of convictions received by it pursuant to 19 the laws of this state and maintain convenient records of the 20 records and reports or make suitable notations in order that an 21 individual record of a person showing the convictions of the person 22 and the traffic collisions in which the person has been involved 23 24 shall be readily ascertainable and available for the consideration SB141 HFLR Page 2

1 of the Department of Public Safety upon any application for a driver license or renewal of a driver license and at other suitable times. 2 3 Any abstract, index or other entry relating to a driving record according to the licensing authority in another state or a province 4 5 of Canada may be posted upon the driving record of any resident of this state when notice thereof is received by documentation or by 6 electronic transmission. The individual record of a person shall 7 not include any collision reports and abstracts of court records 8 9 involving a collision in which the person was not issued a citation 10 or if a citation is issued and the person was not convicted. 11 C. 1. The Commissioner and the officers of the Department as 12 the Commissioner may designate are hereby authorized to prepare under the seal of the Department and deliver upon request a copy of 13 any collision report on file with the Department, charging a fee of: 14 beginning on July 1, 2011, through June 30, 2013, 15 a. - an account to be utilized exclusively for future expenses directly related to the operation of an Oklahoma Highway Patrol Academy, and
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beginning on July 1, 2013, and any year thereafter, b. Seven Dollars (\$7.00).

However, the Department shall not be required to furnish 6 personal information from the collision report which is contrary to 7 the provisions of the Driver's Privacy Protection Act, 18 United 8 9 States Code, Sections 2721 through 2725.

10 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph 1 of this 11 subsection, the Department is authorized to enter into contracts to 12 supply information regarding vehicles reported to be involved in collisions. For each vehicle, the information shall be limited to 13 that which only describes the vehicle and the collision. 14 The Department shall not be required to provide any information 15 regarding the owner or operator of the vehicle or any information 16 which would conflict with Section 2-110 or Section 1109 of this 17 title. 18

The Department of Public Safety or any motor license agent D. 19 upon request shall prepare and furnish to any authorized person a 20 Motor Vehicle Report of any person subject to the provisions of the 21 motor vehicle laws of this state. However, the Department shall not 22 be required to furnish personal information from a driving record 23 24 contrary to the provisions of the Driver's Privacy Protection Act, SB141 HFLR Page 4

1 18 United States Code, Sections 2721 through 2725. The Motor 2 Vehicle Report shall be a summary of the driving record of the 3 person and shall include the enumeration of any motor vehicle collisions, reference to convictions for violations of motor vehicle 4 5 laws, and any action taken against the privilege of the person to operate a motor vehicle, as shown by the files of the Department for 6 7 the three (3) years preceding the date of the request. The Department shall not be required to release to any person, in whole 8 9 or in part and in any format, a driving index, as described in 10 subsection A of this section, except as otherwise provided for by 11 law. For each Motor Vehicle Report furnished by the Department of 12 Public Safety, the Department shall collect the sum of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00), Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) of which shall be 13 deposited in the General Revenue Fund and Five Dollars (\$5.00) shall 14 15 be deposited in the Department of Public Safety Revolving Fund, 16 unless the Motor Vehicle Report is for a commercial driver license, then the Department shall collect the sum of Fifteen Dollars 17 (\$15.00), Ten Dollars (\$10.00) of which shall be deposited in the 18 General Revenue Fund and Five Dollars (\$5.00) shall be deposited in 19 the Department of Public Safety Revolving Fund. For each Motor 20 Vehicle Report furnished by a motor license agent, the agent shall 21 collect the sum of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00), Eighteen Dollars 22 (\$18.00) of which shall be paid to the Oklahoma Tax Commission for 23 24 deposit in the General Revenue Fund in the State Treasury, Five SB141 HFLR

1 Dollars (\$5.00) shall be deposited in the Department of Public 2 Safety Revolving Fund and Two Dollars (\$2.00) of which shall be 3 retained by the motor license agent, unless the Motor Vehicle Report 4 is for a commercial driver license, then the Department shall 5 collect the sum of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00), Eight Dollars (\$8.00) 6 of which shall be paid to the Oklahoma Tax Commission for deposit in 7 the General Revenue Fund in the State Treasury, Five Dollars (\$5.00) shall be deposited in the Department of Public Safety Revolving Fund 8 9 and Two Dollars (\$2.00) of which shall be retained by the motor 10 license agent. Persons sixty-five (65) years of age or older shall 11 not be required to pay a fee for their own Motor Vehicle Report 12 furnished by the Department or a motor license agent. For purposes of this subsection, a Motor Vehicle Report shall include a report 13 which indicates that no driving record is on file with the 14 15 Department of Public Safety for the information received by the Department in the request for the Motor Vehicle Report. 16 The Department shall establish a procedure whereby Motor Vehicle 17 Reports may be purchased at a bulk rate resulting in a lower cost 18 per individual report. Such bulk rate shall be established so that 19 20 no reduction occurs in the amount attributable to the Motor Vehicle Report fee deposited in the General Revenue Fund or the Department 21 of Public Safety Revolving Fund for FY 2016. 22 The Department of Public Safety may develop procedures 23 Ε.

2 2. Who operates a commercial motor vehicle in the course of his 3 or her employment with the employer, may automatically be notified, pursuant to a fee schedule established by the Department, should the 4 5 driving record of a person reflect a traffic conviction in any court or an administrative action by the Department which alters the 6 7 status of the commercial driving privileges of the person. The notification system shall include electronic delivery of a Motor 8 9 Vehicle Report at least annually for any employee who is a 10 commercial driver licensee or who operates a commercial motor 11 vehicle, as required by 49 C.F.R., Section 391.25. All monies 12 received by the Commissioner of Public Safety and the officers and employees of the Department pursuant to this subsection shall be 13 deposited in the Department of Public Safety Restricted Revolving 14 Fund; provided, the fee received for electronic delivery of a Motor 15 Vehicle Report shall be deposited as provided in subsection G of 16 this section. 17

Who has a Class A, B or C driver license; and

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The Commissioner is authorized to establish a procedure for 18 F. reviewing the driving records of state residents who are existing 19 policyholders of any insurance company licensed to operate in this 20 state during specified periods of time and producing a report which 21 identifies the policyholders which have had violation and/or status 22 changes to their driving records during such time period. 23 The 24 Department may sell such report to the insurance company or its SB141 HFLR Page 7

agent at a fee to be set by the Department. Any such report sold by the Department shall only consist of information otherwise lawfully obtainable by the insurance company or its agent. The fee shall be sufficient to recover all costs incurred by the Department and insure that there will be no net revenue loss to the state. Such fee shall be deposited in the Department of Public Safety Revolving Fund.

G. All monies received by the Commissioner of Public Safety and
the officers and employees of the Department shall be remitted to
the State Treasurer to be credited to the General Revenue Fund in
the State Treasury except as otherwise provided for by law.
SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.
