14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 840-5.5, as						
15	last amended by Section 6, Chapter 117, O.S.L. 2014 (74 O.S. Supp.

The appointing authority of agencies participating in the 12 statewide information systems project may establish unclassified positions and appoint unclassified employees to the project as 13 needed. Additional unclassified positions may be established, if 14 required, to appoint an unclassified employee to perform the duties 15 of a permanent classified employee who is temporarily absent from a 16 17 classified position as a result of assignment to this project.
