13	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1951.2 of Title 63, unless
15	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
16	A. Not later than November 1, 2027, the State Commissioner of
17	Health shall promulgate rules governing employer-based training
18	programs for nurse aides including, but not limited to, rules that
19	allow the employment of noncertified nurse aides enrolled in an
20	employer-based training program, subject to the conditions allowed
21	in such rules.
22	B. 1. Until November 1, 2027, an employer-based training
23	program for nurse aides shall consist of at least eighty-five (85)
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¹ hours of training or the equivalent if the facility is subject to
² regulation by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

3 2. Of the total required hours of training or the equivalent as 4 specified in paragraph 1 of this subsection, the program shall 5 include:

- a. at least sixteen (16) hours of supervised practical
 training that is documented and signed by the nurse
 aide trainee,
- 9 b. all of the curriculum specified in 42 C.F.R., Section
 483.152(b), and
- 11 c. pursuant to paragraph 3 of subsection A of Section 1-12 1951 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes, a minimum 13 of ten (10) hours of training in the care of 14 Alzheimer's patients.

15 C. 1. Until November 1, 2027, an employer-based training 16 program for nurse aides shall consist of at least one hundred twenty 17 (120) hours of training or the equivalent if the facility is not 18 subject to regulation by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid 19 Services.

20 2. Of the total required hours of training or the equivalent as 21 specified in paragraph 1 of this subsection, the program shall 22 include:
