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BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1017.2a of Title 56, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. On the effective date of this act, all employees, powers, duties, functions and responsibilities of the Department of Human Services that relate to the ADvantage Waiver Program shall be transferred to the Oklahoma Health Care Authority. The transfer

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shall include all equipment, supplies, records, assets, current and future liabilities, fund balances, encumbrances, obligations, and indebtedness associated with the Department that relate to the ADvantage Waiver Program.

- B. Any monies accruing to or in the name of the Department on and after the effective date of this act that relate to the ADvantage Waiver Program, or any monies that accrue in any funds or accounts or are maintained for the benefit of the Department on and after the effective date of this act that relate to the ADvantage Waiver Program shall be transferred to the Authority.
- C. The Authority shall succeed to any contractual rights and responsibilities incurred by the Department.
- D. The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
  Services is hereby directed to coordinate the transfer of funds,
  allotments, purchase orders, and outstanding financial obligations
  or encumbrances as provided for in this section.
- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1017.2b of Title 56, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. On the effective date of this act, all administrative rules promulgated by the Director of the Department of Human Services that relate to the ADvantage Waiver Program shall be transferred to and become a part of the administrative rules of the Oklahoma Health Care Authority Board. The Office of Administrative Rules in the

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Secretary of State's office shall provide adequate notice in the Oklahoma Register of the transfer of such rules and shall place the transferred rules under the Administrative Code section of the Oklahoma Health Care Authority. Such rules shall continue in force and effect as rules of the Authority from and after the effective date of this act, and any amendment, repeal or addition to the transferred rules shall be under the jurisdiction of the Board.

- B. The Board shall adopt and promulgate rules and standards for the ADvantage Waiver Program and distribution of funds to providers contracted to provide services under the ADvantage Waiver Program.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1017.2c of Title 56, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The Oklahoma Health Care Authority is hereby authorized and directed to enter into agreements and to contract for the provision of services under the ADvantage Waiver Program. Any provider providing services pursuant to a contract with the Authority for the purposes of the ADvantage Waiver Program shall be subject to the provisions of the administrative rules of the Oklahoma Health Care Authority Board.

SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1017.2d of Title 56, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

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        Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the administration
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    of the ADvantage Waiver Program shall be carried out by the Oklahoma
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    Health Care Authority.
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        SECTION 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 2020.
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        SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
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    of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
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    declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
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    be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
