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| 18 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: |
| 19 | SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 1210.508F, |
| 20 | is amended to read as follows: |
| 21 | Section 1210.508F. A. The State Board of Education Commission |
| 22 | for Educational Quality and Accountability shall ensure that the |
| 23 | reading competencies for elementary teachers are included in the |
| 24 27 | competencies for special education teachers. |
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1 The State Board of Education and the Commission for в. 2 Educational Quality and Accountability in collaboration with the 3 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall ensure that all 4 teachers of early childhood education, elementary education, and 5 special education are provided quality training in intervention, 6 instruction, and remediation strategies in order to meet the needs 7 of students in kindergarten through third grade who are determined 8 to be at risk of reading difficulties in the science of reading to 9 provide explicit and systematic instruction in phonological 10 awareness, decoding, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension and 11 implement reading strategies that research has shown to be 12 successful in improving reading among students with reading 13 difficulties. In addition, quality education for prospective 14 teachers shall be provided in research-based instructional 15 strategies for instruction, assessment, and intervention for 16 literacy development for all students τ including advanced readers, 17 typically developing readers, and struggling readers who are coping 18 with a range of challenges, including, but not limited to, English 19 learners and learners with handicapping conditions and learning 20 disabilities (including dyslexia). Quality training shall include 21 guidance from professional resources such as the Report of the 22 National Reading Panel, Response to Intervention guidelines, and 23 professional organizations such as the Council for Exceptional 24 Children, International Dyslexia Association, International Literacy _ _

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Association, National Council of Teachers of English, and National
Association for the Education of Young Children.

3 C. All institutions within The Oklahoma State System of Higher 4 Education that offer elementary, early childhood education, or 5 special education programs approved by the Commission for 6 Educational Quality and Accountability shall incorporate into those 7 programs the requirement that teacher candidates study the five 8 elements of reading instruction which are phonemic phonological 9 awareness, phonics decoding, reading fluency, vocabulary, and 10 comprehension. Teacher candidates shall study strategies including, 11 but not limited to, instruction that is explicitly taught, 12 sequenced, multimodal (reading, writing, speaking, listening, hands-13 on, etc.), multidisciplinary, and reflective to adapt for individual 14 learners.

15 D. Effective July 1, 2010 2025, teacher candidates enrolled in 16 an institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education 17 in a special education, early childhood education, or elementary 18 education program approved by the Commission for Educational Quality 19 and Accountability shall pass, prior to graduation, a comprehensive 20 assessment to measure their teaching skills in the area of reading 21 instruction. The assessment shall be developed and administered by 22 the institutions that offer special education, early childhood 23 education, and elementary education programs that lead to 24 certification. The assessment shall measure the knowledge and _ _

| 10 | is the intent of the Legislature to ensure that teachers graduating |
| 11 | from institutions within The Oklahoma State System of Higher |
| 12 | Education have the knowledge and skills to effectively teach reading |
| 13 | to all children. |
| 14 | SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024. |
| 15 | SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation |
| 16 | of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby |
| 17 | declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and |
| 18 | be in full force from and after its passage and approval. |
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
