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23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
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1 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 51.1, is 2 amended to read as follows:

3 Section 51.1. A. There is hereby created within the Oklahoma 4 Department of Emergency Management, the Oklahoma Office of Homeland 5 Security, that shall be a division under the Oklahoma Department of 6 Emergency Management. The Governor Director of the Department of 7 Emergency Management shall be the chief officer of the Office and 8 shall appoint a Homeland Security <del>Director</del> Advisor who shall be 9 responsible to the Governor Director of Emergency Management for the 10 operation and administration of the Office Division. The Governor 11 Director shall determine the salary for the Director Homeland 12 Security Advisor in cooperation with standards promulgated by the 13 office of Management and Enterprise Services, and may make such 14 expenditures within the appropriation therefor, or from such other 15 available funds as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of the 16 Oklahoma Homeland Security Act and other programs specified by law. 17 The Oklahoma Homeland Security Director Advisor shall в. 18 possess or obtain a federally recognized Top Secret Level Clearance 19 clearances as appropriate to perform the duties of the position. 20 1. Any employee of state government appointed, by the Director 21 of the Department of Emergency Management to the position of 22 Oklahoma Homeland Security Director Advisor shall have a right to 23 return to the previously held <del>classified</del> position of the employee 24

without any loss of rights, privileges, or benefits immediately upon

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<sup>1</sup> completion of the duties as <del>Oklahoma</del> Homeland Security <del>Director</del> <sup>2</sup> <u>Advisor</u>, provided the employee is not otherwise disqualified.

3 2. Any person appointed to the position of Oklahoma Homeland 4 Security Director Advisor, if already a member of a state retirement 5 system, shall be eligible to continue participation in that system. 6 If not a member of a state retirement system, the Director Homeland 7 Security Advisor shall be eligible to participate in the Oklahoma 8 Public Employees Retirement System. The Oklahoma Homeland Security 9 Director shall be eligible for participation in only one retirement 10 system and shall elect in writing the system in which the Director 11 Advisor intends to participate.

3. The Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety may commission the <del>Director of</del> Homeland Security <u>Advisor</u> as a peace officer if at the time of appointment the <u>Director Advisor</u> is certified as a law enforcement officer by the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET) or as a state trooper if at the time of appointment the <u>Director Advisor</u> is a CLEET-certified officer of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol.

C. The Oklahoma <u>Department of Emergency Management's</u> Office of Homeland Security <u>Division</u> shall consist of at least three <del>divisions</del> functions:

- 22 1. Prevention and Intelligence;
- 23 2. Response and Recovery Planning; and
- 24 3. Awareness and Preparedness.

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1 The Director of the Department of Emergency Management shall D. 2 be authorized to employ personnel necessary to achieve the mission 3 of the Homeland Security Office, as a division of the Agency. Other 4 federal, state, and local personnel may be assigned to the Office of 5 Homeland Security pursuant to an interagency agreement. The 6 Governor shall designate at which appropriate state agency the 7 Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security shall be located. That agency 8 shall provide housing, administrative staff and other support to the 9 Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security. All positions and personnel 10 of the Office of Homeland Security shall be exempt from the full-11 time-employee limit of the state agency where the Office of Homeland 12 Security is located. 13 The Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management Office of Ε. 14 Homeland Security Director Division shall have the duty and 15 responsibility to develop and coordinate the implementation and 16 administration of a comprehensive statewide strategy, that is 17 integrated into the State's Emergency Operation Plan to secure the 18 State of Oklahoma from the results of acts of terrorism, from a 19 public health emergency, from cyberterrorism, and from weapons of 20 mass destruction as that term is defined in 18 U.S.C., Section 21 2332a, and to perform other duties assigned by the Governor 22 Director. These duties shall include but not be limited to:

23 1. Representing the State of Oklahoma with federal agencies as 24 the state homeland security director <u>Homeland Security Advisor</u> for

<sup>1</sup> purposes of accessing federal funds and cooperating with federal <sup>2</sup> agencies in the development and implementation of a nationwide <sup>3</sup> homeland security plan of response; and

4 2. Coordinating the Homeland Security efforts within the State 5 of Oklahoma, including working with the Director, the Governor and 6 Legislature, state agencies, and local elected officials and local 7 governments, emergency responder groups, private-sector businesses, 8 educational institutions, volunteer organizations, and the general 9 public. State agencies receiving federal funding for homeland 10 security purposes shall report the amount and intended use of those 11 funds to the Oklahoma Homeland Security Director Department of 12 Emergency Management to ensure efficient use of funds and to avoid 13 duplication of efforts.

F. Included in the comprehensive statewide strategy and consistent with the National Strategy for Homeland Security, as promulgated by the Office of the President of the United States, or its successor plan or plans, the Oklahoma Homeland Security Director <u>Advisor</u> shall establish the following strategic objectives for Oklahoma:

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1. To prevent terrorist attacks;

2. To reduce vulnerability to terrorism;

3. To minimize the damage from and to recover from terrorist attacks; and

4. Such other duties as the Governor may prescribe.

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G. The Oklahoma <u>Department of Emergency Management</u> Office of Homeland Security shall have the following duties:

3 1. Establish a plan for the effective implementation of a 4 statewide emergency All-Hazards response system, including the 5 duties and responsibilities of regional emergency response teams; 6 2. Create, implement, and administer an advisory system; 7 3. Coordinate and prepare applications for federal funds 8 related to homeland security and accessing and distributing the 9 federal funds; and

10 4. Cooperate with federal agencies in the development and 11 implementation of a nationwide homeland security plan or response.

H. The Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department of
 Emergency Management and any local government may enter into
 contracts with each other for equipment and personnel, or both to
 <u>carry out the requirements and duties of the Homeland Security Act</u>.
 The contract may include any provisions agreed upon by the parties
 and as required by any federal or state grant, if applicable.

I. All state agencies and political subdivisions of this state and all officers and employees of those agencies and political subdivisions are hereby directed to cooperate with and lend assistance to the Oklahoma <u>Department of Emergency Management</u> Director and the Homeland Security <del>Director</del> Advisor.

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1 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 51.1a, as 2 amended by Section 700, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (74 O.S. Supp. 3 2019, Section 51.1a), is amended to read as follows: 4 Section 51.1a. A. In addition to the powers and duties as 5 defined elsewhere in statute, the Oklahoma Office of Homeland 6 Security Department of Emergency Management has the duty and 7 responsibility for interoperable public safety communications 8 planning within the State of Oklahoma. As part of this duty the 9 Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Agency shall: 10 1. Annually develop and report to the Governor, President Pro 11 Tempore of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Representatives, 12 the Statewide Communications Interoperability Plan; 13 2. Coordinate statewide planning for public safety 14 communication needs of state government and state emergency 15 responders, including a migration plan for state agency use of 16 public safety communications technologies and rendering of aid 17 between state government and its political subdivisions for 18 organizing and use of disparate public safety communications 19 systems; 20 3. Serve as a focal point for all state-level projects

21 involving public safety communications vendors where the focus of 22 such authority can substantially enhance the state communications 23 plan or savings;

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4. Apply for, receive, and hold, or assist state agencies in applying for, receiving, or holding such authorizations, licenses, and allocations of channels and frequencies to carry out the purposes of this section;

5. Establish minimum standards and protocols for acquisition,
development, or enhancement of public safety communications
7 technologies. These standards shall be utilized by the Information
8 Services Division of the Office of Management and Enterprise
9 Services pursuant to the provisions of Section 34.20 of Title 62 of
10 the Oklahoma Statutes; and

6. Accomplish such other purposes as may be necessary or incidental to the administration of its authority or functions pursuant to law.

14 It is the intent of the Legislature that all state public в. 15 entities comply with the provisions of the Statewide Communications 16 Interoperability Plan issued by the Oklahoma Office of Homeland 17 Security Department of Emergency Management. All state agencies are 18 required to review the provisions of the Statewide Communications 19 Interoperability Plan and the public safety communications standards 20 issued by the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department of 21 Emergency Management prior to the purchase, acquisition, 22 development, or enhancement of any public safety communications 23 system. Local public safety agencies and political subdivisions of 24 the state are encouraged, but not required, to review the provisions \_ \_

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of the Statewide Communications Interoperability Plan and the public safety communications standards issued by the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department of Emergency Management prior to the purchase, acquisition, development, or enhancement of any public safety communications system to assist the local public safety agency or political subdivision in purchasing decisions.

7 C. No state agency shall use state funds or enter into any 8 agreement for the acquisition, development, or enhancement of a 9 public safety communication system unless the request is consistent 10 with the Statewide Communications Interoperability Plan and the 11 public safety communications standards issued by the Oklahoma Office 12 of Homeland Security Department of Emergency Management.

16 Section 51.2. A. There is hereby created in the State Treasury 17 a revolving fund for the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security 18 Department of Emergency Management to be designated the "Oklahoma 19 Homeland Security Revolving Fund". The Oklahoma Homeland Security 20 Revolving Fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal 21 year limitations and shall consist of monies received by the 22 Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department of Emergency 23 Management or the Department of Public Safety from:

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Reimbursements from responsible parties for reasonable
 actions taken and costs incurred by a regional team in response to

4. Gifts, donations, and bequests;

5. Monies appropriated or apportioned by the state; and

14 6. Receipts from other ancillary services related to incidents 15 or events related to dangerous substances, not otherwise provided by 16 law.

B. All monies accruing to the credit of the Oklahoma Homeland
 Security Revolving Fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted
 and expended by the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department
 of Emergency Management for:

21 1. Operating expenses <u>relating to homeland security expenses</u>;
22 2. Administrative duties <u>in support of homeland security</u>
23 functions; and

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<sup>1</sup> 3. Education and reimbursement for expenses of regional teams, <sup>2</sup> including maintenance of equipment.

C. Expenditures from the Oklahoma Homeland Security Revolving Fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

8 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 51.2a, is 9 amended to read as follows:

Section 51.2a. Contingent upon the availability of designated funding from the United States Department of Homeland Security or state appropriations, the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department of Emergency Management shall make grant monies available to:

15 1. Public schools, private schools, technology center schools, and institutions of higher learning in the State of Oklahoma to encourage greater emergency preparedness, including, but not limited to, improvement of plans and procedures for natural and man-made disaster and emergencies, improvement of security on campus, at events, and with regard to buses and other transportation, and improvement of communications strategies and equipment; and

22 2. Local law enforcement, emergency management, disaster 23 relief, and public health entities in the State of Oklahoma to 24 encourage the active engagement of such entities with public

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1 schools, private schools, technology center schools, and 2 institutions of higher learning in their efforts to improve 3 emergency preparedness.

<sup>6</sup> Section 51.2b. A. This section shall be known and may be cited <sup>7</sup> as the "Oklahoma School Security Grant Program Act".

B. The Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department of
 <u>Emergency Management</u> shall solicit proposals for and make grants for
 the enhancement of campus security at institutions of higher
 learning, technology center schools, public schools, and private
 schools.

C. The goals and objectives of the Oklahoma School Security Grant Program are to:

15 1. Increase the awareness of the public and educational 16 institutions of the risks, threats, and vulnerabilities of school 17 campuses as well as mitigation strategies;

18 2. Incentivize participation in school security training 19 programs designed to assess campus risks, threats, and 20 vulnerabilities;

3. Provide assistance to institutions of higher learning, technology center schools, public schools, and private schools initiating or implementing school security plans, programs, and activities; and

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4. Build upon the success of the pilot Education Grant Program
 established by the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security.

D. The Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department of <u>Emergency Management</u> shall determine grant project criteria and establish a process for the consideration of proposals. The proposals shall be considered on a statewide competitive basis among peer institutions.

E. On or before January 1, 2010, and each year thereafter, the
 Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department of Emergency
 <u>Management</u> shall prepare an annual report on the Oklahoma School
 Security Grant Program and submit to the Governor, the President Pro
 Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of
 Representatives.

SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 51.2c, as amended by Section 702, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (74 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 51.2c), is amended to read as follows:

17 Section 51.2c. A. There is hereby created in the State 18 Treasury a revolving fund for the Oklahoma Office of Homeland 19 Security Department of Emergency Management to be designated the 20 "Oklahoma School Security Revolving Fund". The Oklahoma School 21 Security Revolving Fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to 22 fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of monies received by the 23 Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department of Emergency 24 Management from:

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Reimbursements, grants, or other monies received from other
 state agencies and entities of state government for school security;

Reimbursements, grants, or other monies received by the
 Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department of Emergency
 <u>Management</u> from the United States government obligated to school
 security projects;

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3. Gifts, donations, and bequests; and

4. Monies appropriated or apportioned by the state.

9 All monies accruing to the credit of the Oklahoma School Β. 10 Security Revolving Fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted 11 and expended by the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department 12 of Emergency Management for the administration of the Oklahoma 13 School Security Grant Program. Contingent upon the availability of 14 funding, the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department of 15 Emergency Management may make grants each year to institutions of 16 higher learning, technology center schools, public schools, and 17 private schools as provided in Section 51.26 of this title.

18 C. Expenditures from the Oklahoma School Security Revolving 19 Fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer 20 against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the 21 Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and 22 payment.

23SECTION 7.AMENDATORYSection 1, Chapter 54, O.S.L. 201324(74 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 51.2d), is amended to read as follows:

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1 Section 51.2d. A. Upon the effective date of this act July 1, 2 2013, the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department of 3 Emergency Management shall designate a division dedicated function 4 of their office Agency as the "Oklahoma School Security Institute". 5 The Oklahoma School Security Institute shall act as the Β. 6 central repository for the public and private elementary and 7 secondary schools of this state to contact for information on 8 resources made available to the schools in their efforts to enhance 9 school security and assess risks and threats to school campuses. 10 The goals and objectives of the Oklahoma School Security Institute 11 shall include, but not be limited to: 12 1. Maximizing school security training and support to public 13 and private elementary and secondary schools as authorized pursuant 14 to Section 51.2b of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes; 15 2. Assisting and coordinating with public and private 16 elementary and secondary school administrators as required in the 17 development and implementation of safety drills;

18 3. Facilitating efforts of public and private elementary and 19 secondary schools to utilize any available programs or entities 20 specializing in security issues; and

4. Creating and coordinating any working groups when necessary in order to continue developing and implementing new strategies and techniques for future recommendations on school security issues.

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1	C. The Oklahoma School Security Institute may develop a
2	telephone tip line whereby reports of activity that may compromise
3	school safety can be called in and disseminated to the appropriate
4	parties for additional investigation should it be warranted.
5	SECTION 8. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 51.3, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	Section 51.3. A. There are hereby created regional planning
8	and coordination advisory councils for homeland security. The
9	Oklahoma Homeland Security Director Department of Emergency
10	Management Director shall designate the geographical boundaries for
11	each regional advisory council within the state.
12	B. Each regional advisory council shall be composed of the
13	following members:
14	1. A chief of a paid fire department;
15	2. A chief of a volunteer fire department;
16	3. A county sheriff;
17	4. A chief of a police department;
18	5. A physician or hospital administrator;
19	6. An emergency management coordinator;
20	7. An emergency medical services provider;
21	8. A veterinarian;
22	9. A representative of a state or local disaster relief agency;
23	10. A city manager or mayor;
24	11. A county commissioner;

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12. A public health representative;

13. A Council of Government representative;

3 14. A representative of a public school district; and 4 15. A representative of an institution of higher learning. 5 The members of the regional advisory councils shall be С. 6 appointed by the Oklahoma Homeland Security Department of Emergency 7 Management Director. The Director shall appoint from a list of 8 nominees provided to the Director from statewide associations or 9 entities that represent the disciplines to be represented on the 10 advisory councils. All members can be removed for cause by the 11 Director.

D. Each member of a regional advisory council shall reside in or have employment duties within the region to be served by the regional advisory council. Regional advisory council members shall have staggered terms of office not exceeding three (3) years and may be reappointed upon the expiration of a term.

17 Each regional advisory council shall meet at least twice a Е. 18 year or more frequently at the discretion of the Director. The 19 Director or Homeland Security Advisor or designee from the Oklahoma 20 Department of Emergency Management Office of Homeland Security 21 Division shall attend the meetings of the regional advisory 22 councils. A majority of the members of the regional advisory 23 council shall constitute a quorum. The Office of Homeland Security 24 Department of Emergency Management shall establish policies and \_ \_

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1 procedures regarding the operation of the regional advisory
2 councils.

F. The duties and responsibilities of each regional advisory council shall be:

5 1. Assessing and documenting the needs of the region related to 6 homeland security;

Coordinating and cooperating with the Oklahoma Office of
 Homeland Security Department of Emergency Management to achieve the
 strategic objectives prescribed in this act Section 51 et seq. of
 this title; and

3. Other duties and responsibilities as determined by the Oklahoma Homeland Security Department of Emergency Management Director.

SECTION 9. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.

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
