6	An Act relating to the practice of podiatry; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 137, which relates to the Board
7	of Podiatric Medical Examiners; removing certain limitation on appointees; permitting the Governor to
8	consider certain recommendations; updating statutory language; updating statutory reference; and providing
9	an effective date.

11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
12	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 137, is
13	amended to read as follows:
14	Section 137. A. A Board of Podiatric Medical Examiners is
15	hereby re-created, to continue until July 1, 2024, in accordance
16	with the provisions of the Oklahoma Sunset Law. Said The Board
17	shall regulate the practice of podiatric medicine in this state in
18	accordance with the provisions of the Podiatric Medicine Practice
19	Act. The Board, appointed by the Governor, shall be composed of
20	five podiatric physicians licensed to practice podiatric medicine in
21	this state and one lay member representing the public.
22	B. Each podiatric physician member of the Board shall:
23	1. Be a legal resident of this state;
24	

1 2. Have practiced podiatric medicine continuously in this state during the three (3) years immediately preceding appointment to the 2 Board; 3 3. Be free of pending disciplinary action or active 4 5 investigation by the Board; and 4. Be a member in good standing of the American Podiatric 6 Medical Association and of the Oklahoma Podiatric Medical 7 Association. 8 9 C. The lay member of the Board shall: Be a legal resident of this state; 1. 10 Not be a registered or licensed practitioner of any of the 11 2. healing arts or be related, within the third degree of consanguinity 12 or affinity, to any such person; and 13 Participate in Board proceedings only for the purposes of: 3. 14 reviewing, investigating and disposing of written a. 15 complaints regarding the conduct of podiatric 16 physicians, and 17 formulating, adopting and promulgating rules pursuant b. 18 to Article I of the Administrative Procedures Act. 19 Except as provided in subsection E of this section, the term 20 D. of office of each podiatric physician member of the Board shall be 21 five (5) years, with one such member being appointed to the Board 22 each year. The lay member of the Board shall serve a term 23 coterminous with that of the Governor. Each member shall hold 24

1 office until the expiration of the term for which appointed or until 2 a qualified successor has been duly appointed. An appointment shall be made by the Governor within ninety (90) days after the expiration 3 of the term of any member, or the occurrence of a vacancy on the 4 5 Board due to resignation, death, or any other cause resulting in an unexpired term. The appointment of the podiatric physician members 6 shall be made from a list of not less than five persons submitted 7 annually to the Governor by the Oklahoma Podiatric Medical 8 9 Association In selecting appointees, the Governor may consider 10 recommendations from a statewide organization representing podiatric 11 physicians, a state chapter of a national organization representing 12 podiatric physicians, or other groups or individuals in this state. E. Each of the three podiatric physician members of the Board, 13 serving on the effective date of this act September 1, 1993, shall 14 complete the term of office for which he or she was appointed, and 15 the successor to each such member shall be appointed for a term of 16 five (5) years. Within sixty (60) days after the effective date of 17 this act September 1, 1993, the Governor shall appoint two new 18 podiatric physician members to the Board, one for a term expiring 19 July 1, 1997, and one for a term expiring on July 1, 1998. 20 The successor to each such new member shall be appointed for a term of 21 five (5) years. 22

F. Before assuming duties on the Board, each member shall take and subscribe to the oath or affirmation provided in Article XV of

1	the Oklahoma Constitution, which oath or affirmation shall be
2	administered and filed as provided in said the article.
3	G. A member may be removed from the Board by the Governor for
4	cause which shall include, but not be limited to:
5	1. Ceasing to be qualified;
6	2. Being found guilty by a court of competent jurisdiction of a
7	felony or of any offense involving moral turpitude;
8	3. Being found guilty, through due process, of malfeasance,
9	misfeasance or nonfeasance in relation to Board duties;
10	4. Being found mentally incompetent by a court of competent
11	jurisdiction;
12	5. Being found in violation of any provision of the Podiatric
13	Medicine Practice Act; or
14	6. Failing to attend three consecutive meetings of the Board
15	without just cause, as determined by the Board.
16	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
