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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-101.6b, is
16	amended to read as follows:
17	Section 6-101.6b. A. For purposes of this section, "teacher"
18	means the term as defined in paragraph 1 of Section 1-116 of $\overline{\mathtt{Title}}$
19	70 of the Oklahoma Statutes this title, and "support employee" means
20	the term as defined in paragraph 8 of Section 1-116 of this title.
21	B. No school district shall prohibit or take disciplinary
22	action against teachers or support employees for:
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Disclosing public information to correct what the teacher or
 support employee reasonably believes evidences a violation of the
 Oklahoma Constitution or law or a rule promulgated pursuant to law;
 Reporting a violation of the Oklahoma Constitution or state

⁵ or federal law; or

3. Taking any of the above actions without giving prior notice
7 to the teacher's <u>or support employee's</u> supervisor or anyone else in
8 the teacher's relevant chain of command.

9 C. For the purposes of this section, "reporting" means 10 providing a spoken or written account to a supervising teacher, 11 administrator, school board member, representative from the State 12 Department of Education, law enforcement official, district 13 attorney, and/or parent or legal guardian of a student directly 14 impacted by the actions.

D. Each school district shall prominently post or publish a copy of this section of law in locations where it can reasonably be expected to come to the attention of all teachers <u>and support</u> employees.

E. Nothing in this section shall be construed to allow a teacher <u>or a support employee</u> to violate students' or parents' rights to confidentiality and protection under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act <u>of 1974</u> (FERPA).

23 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.

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1	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
2	of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby
3	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
4	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
