- C. A trustee of a trust described in subsection B of this section shall pay to the personal representative of the settlor's estate any expenses of the administration and obligations of the settlor's estate that the personal representative certifies in writing that the trustee is required to pay. The interests of all beneficiaries of such a trust are subject to the provisions of this subsection.
- D. Upon the death of a settlor of a trust described in subsection B of this section, the trustee shall file a notice of trust with the office of the county clerk of Oklahoma County.
- 1. The notice of trust shall contain the full legal name of the settlor as stated on the death certificate, any known aliases of the settlor, the settlor's date of death, the title of the trust, the date of the trust, and the name and address of the trustee or trustees.
- 2. The filing office shall assign a unique number to the filed record and maintain it for public inspection, indexed by the name of the settlor, any known aliases of the settlor, and the title of the trust.

4	E. Any limitations period that would operate to bar an action
5	against the decedent or the decedent's estate shall be tolled for
