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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:	
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1722, is	
14	amended to read as follows:	
15	Section 1722. As used in the Licensed Dietitian Act:	
16	1. "Board" means the State Board of Medical Licensure and	
17	Supervision.	
18	2. "Committee" means the Advisory Committee on Dietetic	
19	Registration of the State Board of Medical Examiners.	
20	3. "Dietetics" means the professional discipline of applying	
21	and integrating scientific principles of nutrition pursuant to	
22	different health, social, cultural, physical, psychological, and	
23	economic conditions to the proper nourishment, care, and education	
24	of individuals or groups throughout the life cycle. The term	

includes the development, management, and provision of nutritional
services integration and application of principles derived from the
sciences of nutrition, biochemistry, food, physiology, management,
behavioral and social science to achieve and maintain client health
through the provision of nutrition care services, which shall
include:

- a. assessing the nutritional needs of individuals and groups based upon appropriate biochemical,

 anthropometric, physical, and dietary data to determine nutrient needs and recommend to the primary health care provider appropriate nutritional intake including enteral and parenteral nutrition,
- b. establishing priorities, goals, and objectives that meet nutritional needs and are consistent with available resources,
- c. providing nutrition care and interventions based on assessment,
- d. providing nutrition counseling by advising and assisting individuals or groups on appropriate nutritional intake by integrating information from the nutritional assessment with information on food and other sources of nutrients and meal preparation consistent with cultural background and socioeconomic status,

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- e. developing, implementing, and managing nutrition care systems,
- evaluating, amending, and maintaining standards of quality in food and nutrition care services,
- planning menus to meet nutritional needs of patients

 to the extent medically possible, in accordance with

 Dietary Reference Intakes (DRIs) of the Food and

 Nutrition Board of the Institute of Medicine, National

 Academy of Sciences, and
- h. prescribing diets to meet the medical needs of patients based on assessment, in accordance with federal regulatory guidelines.
- 4. "Licensed dietitian" means a person licensed pursuant to the provisions of the Licensed Dietitian Act.
- 5. "Provisional licensed dietitian" means a person who has a limited license pursuant to the provisions of the Licensed Dietitian Act.
- 6. "Degree" means a degree from an accredited college or university.
- 20 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1740 of Title 59, unless there 22 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- Nothing in the Licensed Dietitian Act shall be construed as to affect or prevent:

1. A student enrolled in an approved academic program in dietetics or nutrition from engaging in the practice of dietetics/nutrition, if such practice constitutes a part of a supervised course of study, and if the student is designated by a title which clearly indicates his or her status as a student or trainee, or from engaging in the practice of dietetics or nutrition under the supervision of a licensed dietitian/nutritionist;

- 2. A dietitian or nutritionist who is serving in the Armed Forces or any other federal agency from engaging in the practice of dietetics or nutrition, provided such practice is related to service or employment;
- 3. Persons licensed to practice the professions of dentistry, medicine, osteopathy, chiropractic, nursing or pharmacy from engaging in the practice of dietetics or nutrition when incidental to the practice of their profession, except that such persons may not use the titles "dietitian", "dietician", or "nutritionist";
- 4. A person from marketing or distributing food, food materials or food supplements or a person from engaging in an explanation of the use or preparation of these products or from furnishing general nutrition information related to such products in connection with the marketing or distribution of such products, if that person does not represent himself or herself as a dietitian or nutritionist; or
- 5. A person from providing weight control services through a program which has been reviewed by, consultation is available from,

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    and no program change can be initiated without prior approval by a
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    licensed dietitian or nutritionist, a dietitian or nutritionist
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    licensed in another state which has licensure requirements at least
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    as stringent as the requirements for licensure specified herein or a
    dietitian registered by the Commission on Dietetic Registration of
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    the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics.
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        SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.
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
