- b. that can reasonably be construed as being for the purpose of sexual gratification of the licensed mental health professional.
- C. A licensed mental health professional as defined by Section 1-103 of Title 43A of the Oklahoma Statutes who engages in therapeutic deception of a patient or former patient shall be subject to any applicable criminal sanctions as follows:
- 1. A single act of therapeutic deception by a licensed mental health professional with one current or former patient shall be a felony punishable by a fine not exceeding Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) and the immediate revocation of the licensed mental health professional's license by the appropriate licensing board;
- 2. Multiple acts of therapeutic deception by a licensed mental health professional with one current or former patient shall be a felony punishable by a fine not exceeding Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) and the immediate revocation of the licensed mental

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 14-101 of Title 43A, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Protection Against Sexual Exploitation by a Mental Health Services Provider Act".
- B. As used in the Protection Against Sexual Exploitation By a Mental Health Services Provider Act:

"Therapeutic deception" means any act, scheme, plan or pattern by a licensed mental health professional:

a. intended to cause a person to believe that performing, or failing to perform, an act would result in serious physical, financial or emotional harm or distress to or physical restraint against any person, and

- b. that can reasonably be construed as being for the purpose of sexual gratification of the licensed mental health professional.
- C. A licensed mental health professional as defined by Section 1-103 of Title 43A of the Oklahoma Statutes who engages in therapeutic deception of a patient or former patient shall be subject to any applicable criminal sanctions as follows:
- 1. A single act of therapeutic deception by a licensed mental health professional with one current or former patient shall be a felony punishable by a fine not exceeding Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) and the immediate revocation of the licensed mental health professional's license by the appropriate licensing board;
- 2. Multiple acts of therapeutic deception by a licensed mental health professional with one current or former patient shall be a felony punishable by a fine not exceeding Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) and the immediate revocation of the licensed mental health professional's license by the appropriate licensing board; and
- 3. Multiple acts of therapeutic deception by a licensed mental health professional with two or more current or former patients shall be a felony punishable by a fine not exceeding Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) and the immediate revocation of the licensed mental health professional's license by the appropriate licensing board.
