14 AMENDMENT NO. 1. Replace the title, enacting clause and entire bill
15 and insert

16 "An Act relating to memorial bridge designations;
17 designating the Silver Star Recipient Captain John
18 Lee Prichard Memorial Bridge; amending Section 1,
19 Chapter 216, O.S.L. 2017 (69 O.S. Supp. 2017,
20 Section 1600.2), which relates to bridge naming;
21 changing location of Joseph Oklahombi bridge;
22 requiring certain markers; providing for
23 codification; providing an effective date; and
24 declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

1 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.269 of Title 69, unless
3 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 The bridge on U.S. Highway 77 over Northeast 122nd Street within
5 the municipal limits of Oklahoma City shall be designated as the
6 "Silver Star Recipient Captain John Lee Prichard Memorial Bridge".
7 The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent
8 markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

9 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 216, O.S.L.
10 2017 (69 O.S. Supp. 2017, Section 1600.2), is amended to read as
11 follows:

12 Section 1600.2 A. This section shall be known and may be cited
13 as the "Choctaw Code Talkers Bridge Naming Program Act".

14 B. The program shall be administered by the Oklahoma Department
15 of Transportation.

16 C. The following bridges are hereby designated to recognize the
17 service, valor and dedication of the Choctaw Code Talkers of World
18 War I and World War II:

19 1. The bridge located on U.S. Highway 270 over Mountain Creek
20 west of Wister in LeFlore County shall be designated for Albert
21 Billy, WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

22 2. The bridge located on State Highway 3 approximately one and
23 three-tenths (1.3) miles east of the intersection of State Highway 3
24

1 and County Road N4495 in McCurtain County shall be designated for
2 Mitchell Bobb, WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

3 3. The bridge located on State Highway 3 approximately two
4 thousand (2,000) feet west of the town of Oleta in Pushmataha County
5 shall be designated for Victor Brown, WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

6 4. The bridge located on U.S. Highway 259 approximately five
7 and three-quarter (5.75) miles south of Smithville in McCurtain
8 County shall be designated for Ben Carterby, WWI Choctaw Code
9 Talker;

10 5. The bridge located on U.S. Highway 70 approximately six
11 hundred (600) feet west of the intersection of U.S. Highway 70 and
12 County Road N3770 in Bryan County shall be designated for Ben
13 Colbert, WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

14 6. The bridge located on State Highway 3 over Beaver Creek east
15 of Antlers in Pushmataha County shall be designated for George E.
16 Davenport, WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

17 7. The bridge located on State Highway 3 over Dumpling Creek
18 east of Antlers in Pushmataha County shall be designated for Joseph
19 H. Davenport, WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

20 8. The bridge located on State Highway 3 over Boktuklo Creek
21 west of Broken Bow in McCurtain County shall be designated for James
22 M. Edwards, WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

1 9. The bridge located on U.S. Highway 70 over Raymond Gary Lake
2 in Choctaw shall be designated for Tobias W. Frazier, WWI Choctaw
3 Code Talker;

4 10. The bridge located on U.S. Highway 70 over Sulphur Creek at
5 the intersection of U.S. Highway 70 and County Road E2078 in Bryan
6 County shall be designated for Benjamin Hampton, WWI Choctaw Code
7 Talker;

8 11. The bridge located on U.S. Highway 259 crossing over Eagle
9 Fork Creek approximately one-half (0.5) mile south of Smithville in
10 McCurtain County shall be designated for Noel Johnson, WWI Choctaw
11 Code Talker;

12 12. The bridge located on State Highway 48 over Sincere Creek
13 in eastern Pontotoc County shall be designated for Otis Leader, WWI
14 Choctaw Code Talker;

15 13. The bridge located on U.S. Highway 259 over Yanubbee Creek
16 north of Broken Bow in McCurtain County shall be designated for
17 Solomon Bond Louis, WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

18 14. The bridge located on State Highway 7 over Pennington Creek
19 in central Johnston County shall be designated for Pete Maytubby,
20 WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

21 15. The bridge located on northbound State Highway 3
22 approximately two thousand three hundred (2,300) feet north of the
23 State Highway 3 bridge over Little River in McCurtain County shall
24 be designated for Jeff Nelson, WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

1 16. The bridge located on ~~U.S. State~~ Highway ~~70~~ 98 over ~~Big~~
2 Horsepen Creek east of Bokchite five and two-tenths (5.2) miles
3 southwest of the intersection of State Highway 3 in Bryan McCurtain
4 County shall be designated for Joseph Oklahombi, WWI Choctaw Code
5 Talker;

6 17. The bridge located on southbound State Highway 3
7 approximately two thousand three hundred (2,300) feet north of the
8 State Highway 3 bridge over Little River in McCurtain County shall
9 be designated for Robert Taylor, WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

10 18. The bridge located on the U.S. Highway 70 Bypass over Old
11 Highway 70 east of Durant in Bryan County shall be designated for
12 Charles Walter Veach, WWI Choctaw Code Talker;

13 19. The bridge located on U.S. Highway 70 at the intersection
14 of U.S. Highway 70 and County Road N4750 east of Broken Bow in
15 McCurtain County shall be designated for Calvin Wilson, WWI Choctaw
16 Code Talker;

17 20. The bridge located on State Highway 113 approximately one
18 and one-quarter (1.25) miles south of the intersection of State
19 Highway 113 and County Road E1368 in Pittsburg County shall be
20 designated for Forreston Baker, WWII Choctaw Code Talker;

21 21. The bridge located on State Highway 1 approximately one
22 thousand eight hundred (1,800) feet west of the intersection of
23 State Highway 1 and the Indian Nation Turnpike in Pittsburg County
24 shall be designated for Schlicht Billy, WWII Choctaw Code Talker;

1 22. The bridge located on State Highway 1 approximately one and
2 six-tenths (1.6) miles west of the intersection of State Highway 1
3 and the Indian Nation Turnpike in Pittsburg County shall be
4 designated for Andrew Perry, WWII Choctaw Code Talker; and

5 23. The bridge on State Highway 31 at the eastern municipal
6 limits of Krebs shall be designated for Davis Pickens, WWII Choctaw
7 Code Talker.

8 D. The Department shall cause suitable permanent markers
9 bearing the names listed pursuant to subsection C of this section to
10 be placed upon the corresponding bridges designated in subsection C
11 of this section.

12 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2018.

13 SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
14 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
15 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
16 be in full force from and after its passage and approval."

17 within the municipal limits of Oklahoma City shall be designated as

19 Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable
20 permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

21 SECTION 6. This act shall become effective July 1, 2018.

22 SECTION 7. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
23 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby

2 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
