8 9	322, O.S.L. 2016 (70 O.S. Supp. 2017, Section 6-190), which relates to qualifications for teacher employment and certification; modifying reference to
10	a certificate to teach; directing the State Board of Education to issue a career teaching certificate to
11	individuals who meet certain criteria; directing the Board to issue a lead teaching certificate to individuals who meet certain criteria; directing the
12	Board to issue a mentor teaching certificate to individuals who meet certain criteria; updating
13	references to certain types of teaching certificates; requiring contracts for mentor and leading teaching
14	certificate candidates to include certain items; directing the State Department of Education to make
15	certain teaching certificates available beginning in certain school year; directing the Department to
16	identify certain school districts to implement certain teaching certificates on a pilot program
17	basis during certain school years; directing the Department to seek funding for implementation of
18	certain salary supplements; and providing an effective date.

21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
22	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 6-190, as
23	last amended by Section 1, Chapter 322, O.S.L. 2016 (70 O.S. Supp.
24	2017, Section 6-190), is amended to read as follows:

Beginning July 1, 2004, any person applying for initial any 4 D. Oklahoma certification shall have on file with the Board a current 5 Oklahoma criminal history record from the Oklahoma State Bureau of 6 Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as 7 defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 8 Upon 9 receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record, the Board may issue 10 a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt of 11 the national fingerprint-based criminal history record. The person 12 applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the cost of the criminal history records. 13

E. Any person holding a valid certificate, issued prior to
January 1, 1997, shall be a certified teacher for purposes of the
Oklahoma Teacher Preparation Act, subject to any professional
development requirements prescribed by the Oklahoma Teacher
Preparation Act or by the State Board of Education.

F. 1. The Board shall issue a <u>career teaching</u> certificate to teach to a person who holds a valid out-of-state certificate or to a person who holds a valid out-of-country certificate and meets any requirements established by the Board. The certificate to teach shall only be for those subject areas and grade levels most closely

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1 aligned to the subject areas and grade levels recognized on the out-2 of-state or out-of-country certificate.

2. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall not be required to take any competency examinations in those subject areas and grade levels most closely aligned to the subject areas and grade levels recognized on the out-of-state or out-of-country certificate.

3. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this 8 9 subsection shall have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma 10 criminal history record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as 11 defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 12 Upon receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record check, the Board may 13 issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt 14 15 of the national fingerprint-based criminal history record check. The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the 16 cost of the criminal history record checks. 17

The Board shall promulgate rules establishing a process by
 which out-of-country certificates will be reviewed and evaluated for
 purposes of awarding a certificate to teach pursuant to this
 subsection.

G. 1. The Board shall issue a <u>career teaching</u> certificate to teach to a person who has successfully completed a competency exam used in a majority of the other states. The certificate to teach

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shall only be for those subject areas and grade levels that
 correspond with a certification area used in Oklahoma.

3 2. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this 4 subsection shall have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma 5 criminal history record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as 6 defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon 7 receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record check, the Board may 8 9 issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt 10 of the national fingerprint-based criminal history record check. 11 The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the 12 cost of the criminal history record checks.

H. The terms of the contracts issued to mentor and lead
 teaching certificate candidates shall include the following:

Mentor: an additional ten (10) days to be used to strengthen
 instructional leadership. A mentor teacher shall receive an annual
 salary supplement of at least Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) in
 addition to the salary for which the teacher qualifies pursuant to
 Section 18-114.14 of this title.

20 <u>2. Lead: an additional fifteen (15) days to be used to</u>
21 <u>strengthen leadership. A lead teacher shall receive an annual</u>
22 <u>salary supplement of at least Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) in</u>
23 <u>addition to the salary for which the teacher qualifies pursuant to</u>
24 Section 18-114.14 of this title.

1	I. The State Department of Education shall make teaching
2	certificates provided for in this section available to all eligible
3	certified teachers beginning in the 2021-2022 school year.
4	J. For the 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 school years, the Department
5	shall identify school districts to implement the teacher
6	certificates provided for in this section on a pilot program basis
7	with the assistance of public-private partnerships, funding from
8	philanthropic organizations or federal grants.
9	K. The Department shall seek funding necessary for
10	implementation of the salary supplements required by subsection H of
11	this section.
12	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
