16 17	recognizing the role of state employees in that event; remembering those state workers who were injured and mourning those killed in the attack.

21	WHEREAS, on April 19, 1995, at 9:02 a.m., Oklahoma City became
22	the site of the worst act of home-grown terrorism on American soil
23	when the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building was bombed, killing 168
24	people, including 19 children, and injuring hundreds more; and

1 WHEREAS, 230 state employees from 13 different state agencies were in the vicinity of the bomb. Of these, eight state agencies 2 3 and 222 employees were housed inside the Oklahoma Water Resources Board and Journal Record buildings. State agencies housed in the 4 5 Journal Record building were Basic Health Benefits Board, Oklahoma Historical Society - State Preservation Office, Criminal Justice 6 7 Resource Center, Truth in Sentencing Policy Advisory Commission, Oklahoma Guaranteed Student Loans, Oklahoma Tuition Aid Grant, 8 9 Oklahoma Small Business Development Center, Risk Management Division 10 - Department of Central Services, and the Oklahoma Department of 11 Securities; and

12 WHEREAS, three of those killed in the bombing were state employees including Oklahoma Water Resources Board employees Robert 13 N. Chipman and Trudy Jean Rigney, and University Hospital employee 14 Laura Garrison, who was in the Social Security Office that morning. 15 More than a hundred state employees were injured including employees 16 working in the agencies previously mentioned, plus employees from 17 the Oklahoma Employment Security Commission, the Department of 18 Labor, the Oklahoma Department of Transportation and the Department 19 of Rehabilitation Services; and 20

21 WHEREAS, numerous state employees assisted as first responders 22 immediately after the blast and continued to assist in securing the 23 site and assisting with the search and rescue operation, the 24 investigation and prosecution of the case and the state's overall

1 recovery. Agencies included in these immediate and long term 2 response efforts included the Oklahoma Highway Patrol, University 3 Hospitals, Department of Emergency Management, the Medical Examiner's office, the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, the 4 5 Military Department, the Oklahoma National Guard, OETA, the District Attorneys Council, the Attorney General's office, the Indigent 6 7 Defense System, the Department of Human Services, the Department of Health, the Department of Education, the Oklahoma Employment 8 9 Security Commission, the Insurance Department, the Department of 10 Corrections, the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse 11 Services, the Legislature, the Oklahoma Court System and virtually 12 all other state agencies; and WHEREAS, strong leadership during Oklahoma's darkest hour was 13 provided by Governor Frank and Mrs. Keating, Lt. Governor Mary 14 Fallin, and all of our state's elected officials; and 15 WHEREAS, the year 2020 marks the 25th anniversary of this dark 16 event in our state's history; and 17 WHEREAS, this landmark anniversary year has raised the Murrah 18 Bombing back to the consciousness of all Americans; and 19 WHEREAS, the Oklahoma City National Memorial and Museum has 20 declared the year 2020 to be a year of THINKING BACK and LOOKING 21 FORWARD. 22 23
