1 ENGROSSED SENATE TULOL RESOLUTION NO. 22 By: McCortney of the Senate 3 and McCall of the House 4 5 6 7 A Joint Resolution disapproving certain proposed amendments to Rules of the Ethics Commission as submitted to the Legislature on February 4, 2019. 8 9 10 11 WHEREAS, pursuant to its authority under Article XXIX of the Oklahoma Constitution, on February 4, 2019, the Ethics Commission 12 13 submitted proposed rule amendments to the Legislature; and WHEREAS, pursuant to subsection C of Section 3 of Article XXIX 14 of the Oklahoma Constitution, the Legislature may, by joint 15 resolution, disapprove any rules promulgated by the Ethics 16 Commission during the legislative session in which these rules were 17 submitted; and 18 WHEREAS, at its public hearings as required in subsection B of 19 Section 3 of Article XXIX of the Oklahoma Constitution, the Ethics 20 Commission received numerous comments and testimony from persons 21 affected by the proposed rule amendments which expressed concerns 22 regarding the changes, including but not limited to concerns that 23 the Commission may have exceeded its authority under Article XXIX of

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the Oklahoma Constitution which limits the Commission's authority to the promulgation of "rules of ethical conduct for state officers and employees" and "rules of ethical conduct for campaigns for elective

4 office"; and

WHEREAS, in 2018, the Ethics Commission submitted rule amendments which were questioned by the Attorney General, as chief legal officer of this state, as exceeding the Commission's authority with respect to protected constitutional rights of certain state employees. These provisions, without corrections to address the concerns of the Attorney General, were again submitted in 2019; and WHEREAS, other provisions submitted in 2019 could violate the provisions of the United States Constitution by denying business, professional and labor organizations the right to organize and sponsor candidate forums; and

WHEREAS, the Ethics Commission has disregarded public opinion and concerns as expressed by such comments and testimony, thereby risking legal action if the proposed rule amendments are permitted to take effect; and

WHEREAS, the Ethics Commission has cited no incidents of unethical conduct on the part of state officers and employees which would outweigh these concerns; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that the 2019 proposed amendments to the Ethics Rules are not consistent with the authority granted by Article XXIX of the Oklahoma Constitution and the public

1	policy of this state, and are not in the best interests of the
2	citizens of Oklahoma.
3	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF
4	REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 57TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
5	SECTION 1. The proposed amendments to the following Rules of
6	the Ethics Commission, as submitted to the Legislature on February
7	4, 2019, are hereby disapproved: Rules 2.2, 2.33, 2.37, 2.41, 2.81,
8	4.18, 4.22, 5.3, 5.5 and 5.25.
