AN ACT

1 Amending Title 27 (Environmental Resources) of the Pennsylvania
2 Consolidated Statutes, providing for Plastic Pollution Task
3 Force and for its powers and duties.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5 hereby enacts as follows:

6 Section 1. Title 27 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7 Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

3 § 6701. Scope of chapter.

4 This chapter relates to the Plastic Pollution Task Force.

5 § 6702. Findings.

6 The General Assembly finds that:

7 (1) Over the years, plastic pollution has taken a toll
8 on the environmental well-being of this Commonwealth.

9 (2) Both marine and terrestrial wildlife have been
10 affected by the rise of plastic pollution.

11 § 6703. Definitions.

12 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
13 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
14 context clearly indicates otherwise:

15 "Department." The Department of Environmental Protection of
16 the Commonwealth.

17 "Secretary." The Secretary of Environmental Protection of
18 the Commonwealth.

19 "Task force." The Plastic Pollution Task Force established
20 under section 6704 (relating to establishment).

21 § 6704. Establishment.

22 The Plastic Pollution Task Force is established within the
23 department.

24 § 6705. Membership.

25 The task force shall consist of the following members:

26 (1) The secretary, or a designee, who shall serve as the
27 chairperson of the task force.

28 (2) The Secretary of Health, or a designee.

29 (3) Three members of the public appointed by the
30 Governor as follows, who shall be appointed within 30 days of

1 the effective date of this section:

2 (i) One member of this Commonwealth's business
3 community with expertise, knowledge or experience in
4 plastic recycling and disposal.

5 (ii) One member of this Commonwealth's academic
6 community with expertise, knowledge and experience in
7 environmental protection, ecology or plastic pollution
8 mitigation.

9 (iii) One member from a national or Statewide
10 environmental organization with expertise, knowledge or
11 experience in environmental protection, ecology or
12 plastic pollution mitigation.

13 § 6706. Meetings.

14 (a) First meeting.--The first meeting of the task force
15 shall be convened within 45 days of the effective date of this
16 section.

17 (b) Conduct of meetings.--The following shall apply to
18 meetings of the task force:

19 (1) The physical presence of a majority of the members
20 shall constitute a quorum.

21 (2) Action of the task force must be authorized by a
22 majority vote of members.

23 (3) A member not physically present may participate by
24 teleconference or videoconference.

25 (4) The chairperson shall schedule a meeting upon
26 written request of a three-fifths majority of the members.

27 (c) Public hearings.--The task force shall hold public
28 hearings as necessary to obtain information.

29 (d) Cooperation between departments.--The department and the
30 Department of Health shall cooperate to provide administrative

1 or other assistance to the task force.

2 (e) Reimbursement.--Members may not receive compensation but
3 shall be reimbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses
4 incurred in the service of the task force.

5 § 6707. Powers and duties.

6 The task force shall have the following powers and duties:

7 (1) To study the most efficient means of reducing
8 plastic pollution in this Commonwealth and its waters.

9 (2) To develop uniform policies for the State and local
10 government units to address plastic pollution and for a
11 coordinated response to the threat posed by plastic pollution
12 to this Commonwealth's ecological and environmental
13 resources.

14 (3) To hold public hearings for the taking of testimony
15 and the requesting of documents.

16 (4) Through its chairperson, to administer oaths and
17 affirmations to witnesses appearing before the task force.

18 (5) To issue a final report, no later than one year
19 after the effective date of this section, to the Governor,
20 the Senate and the House of Representatives. In addition to
21 any information that the task force deems appropriate, the
22 report shall include recommendations regarding the following:

23 (i) Reducing the amount of plastic entering the
24 waste stream.

25 (ii) Reducing and removing existing plastic
26 pollution.

27 (iii) Addressing microplastic pollution in the
28 waterways of this Commonwealth.

29 (iv) Restoring ecosystems that have been damaged by
30 plastic pollution to ecosystems' natural condition.

1 (v) Estimating the resources necessary for the
2 implementation of the policies suggested in the report.

3 (vi) Specific legislative recommendations and
4 regulatory action and model ordinances that are necessary
5 to implement the recommendations in the report.

6 (vii) Establishing State and local programs to
7 mitigate plastic pollution, provide financial and market
8 tools and educational programs that may be employed to
9 help reduce plastic pollution and develop other tools or
10 resources the task force deems effective to combat
11 plastic pollution in this Commonwealth.

12 § 6708. Report.

13 The report made under this act shall be:

14 (1) Approved at a public meeting in accordance with
15 section 6706 (relating to meetings).

16 (2) A public record under the act of February 14, 2008
17 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-Know Law.

18 § 6709. Expiration.

19 The task force shall expire 30 days after issuing the final
20 report under section 6707(5) (relating to powers and duties).

21 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
