1 2 3	Amending Title 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in miscellaneous provisions, providing for mentorship program for former incarcerated individuals.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Title 61 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
8	§ 5908. Mentorship program for former incarcerated individuals.
9	(a) Establishment The department shall promulgate
10	regulations to establish a mentorship program for former
11	incarcerated individuals. The program shall authorize former
12	<pre>incarcerated individuals to:</pre>
13	(1) mentor current incarcerated individuals; and
14	(2) assist current incarcerated individuals in
15	acclimating to society upon release or discharge from
16	correctional institutions.
17	(b) Duties To qualify for participation in the program_

- 1 <u>established under subsection (a), a former incarcerated</u>
- 2 individual shall:
- 3 (1) participate in a mentorship training course
- 4 <u>established by the department, which shall include education</u>
- 5 about trauma-informed care; and
- 6 (2) meet any other criteria required by the department
- 7 to successfully mentor a current incarcerated individual.
- 8 (c) Mental health services. -- The department shall provide
- 9 <u>access to mental health services for a former incarcerated</u>
- 10 individual who mentors a current incarcerated individual under
- 11 this section and the current incarcerated individual while in
- 12 the department facilities. Nothing in this subsection shall be
- 13 construed to prevent a current incarcerated individual from
- 14 accessing mental health services at any other time during the
- 15 current incarcerated individual's incarceration.
- 16 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
