| 9 | Section 1. The act of November 10, 1999 (P.L.491, No.45), |
| 10 | known as the Pennsylvania Construction Code Act, is amended by |

| 12 | Section 306. Diaper changing stations in public facilities. |
| 13 | (a) General ruleAn individual, corporation, partnership, |
| 14 | company, organization, association or other business entity that |
| 15 | owns or manages a public facility with at least one restroom |
| 16 | that is open to the public shall install and maintain a safe, |
| 17 | sanitary, convenient and publicly accessible diaper changing |
| 18 | <u>station in each public restroom.</u> |
| 19 | (b) ComplianceExcept as provided in subsection (c), all |

| 1 | existing public facilities, new construction and renovations for |
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| 2 | which a permit has been obtained shall comply with the |
| 3 | requirements under subsection (a). An existing public facility |
| 4 | which is not in compliance shall have 90 days from the effective |
| 5 | date of this subsection to meet the requirements under |
| 6 | subsection (a). |
| 7 | (c) ExceptionThis section does not apply to existing |
| 8 | public facilities, new construction or renovations for which a |
| 9 | permit has been obtained if a code administrator determines that |
| 10 | the installation of a diaper changing station is not feasible or |
| 11 | would result in a failure to comply with applicable building |
| 12 | standards governing the right of access for individuals with |
| 13 | <u>disabilities.</u> |
| 14 | (d) SignageA public facility shall ensure the following: |
| 15 | (1) Each public restroom shall include signage at or |
| 16 | near the entrance to the public restroom indicating the |
| 17 | location of the diaper changing station. |
| 18 | (2) If there is a central directory identifying, for the |
| 19 | benefit of the public, the location of offices, restrooms and |
| 20 | other facilities in the building, that central directory |
| 21 | shall indicate the location of diaper changing stations. |
| 22 | (e) Maintenance, repair and cleaningA diaper changing |
| 23 | station shall be maintained, repaired and replaced as necessary |
| 24 | to ensure safety and ease of use and shall be cleaned with the |
| 25 | same frequency as the restroom in which it is located. |
| 26 | (f) ApplicabilityThis section does not apply to an |
| 27 | industrial building or to a nightclub or bar that does not |
| 28 | permit anyone who is under 18 years of age to enter the premises |
| 29 | or to a restroom located in a health facility if the restroom is |
| 30 | intended for the use of one patient or resident at a time. |
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| 1 | (g) DefinitionsAs used in this section, the following |
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| 2 | words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this |
| 3 | subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise: |
| 4 | "Commonwealth agency." An agency, authority or other |
| 5 | instrumentality of the Commonwealth. |
| 6 | "Diaper changing station." A table or other device suitable |
| 7 | for changing the diaper of a child three years of age or |
| 8 | younger. |
| 9 | "Health facility." A facility, place or building that is |
| 10 | organized, maintained and operated for the diagnosis, care, |
| 11 | prevention and treatment of human illness, including |
| 12 | convalescence and rehabilitation and care during and after |
| 13 | pregnancy, for one or more individuals, to which the individuals |
| 14 | are admitted for a 24-hour stay or longer. |
| 15 | "Public facility." Any of the following: |
| 16 | (1) A public building owned by a Commonwealth agency or |
| 17 | a portion of a building that is owned by the Commonwealth and |
| 18 | includes at least one restroom that is open to the public. |
| 19 | (2) A public building owned by a municipality or portion |
| 20 | of a building that is owned by a municipality and includes at |
| 21 | least one restroom that is open to the public. |
| 22 | (3) A theater or movie house, grocery store, health |
| 23 | facility, convention center, sports arena, auditorium, |
| 24 | cultural complex, exhibition hall, library, passenger |
| 25 | terminal, permanent amusement park structure, restaurant with |
| 26 | occupancy of at least 60 persons, shopping center of more |
| 27 | than 25,000 square feet, tourist attraction or retail store |
| 28 | <u>of more than 5,000 square feet.</u> |
| 29 | Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days. |

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
