AN ACT

- Amending the act of July 28, 1988 (P.L.556, No.101), entitled "An act providing for planning for the processing and 2 disposal of municipal waste; requiring counties to submit 3 plans for municipal waste management systems within their 4 boundaries; authorizing grants to counties and municipalities 5 for planning, resource recovery and recycling; imposing and 6 7 collecting fees; establishing certain rights for host municipalities; requiring municipalities to implement 8 recycling programs; requiring Commonwealth agencies to 9 procure recycled materials; imposing duties; granting powers 10 to counties and municipalities; authorizing the Environmental 11 Quality Board to adopt regulations; authorizing the 12 Department of Environmental Resources to implement this act; 13 providing remedies; prescribing penalties; establishing a 14 fund; and making repeals," further providing for site 15 16 limitation. - 18 hereby enacts as follows:
- 19 Section 1. Section 511(a) of the act of July 28, 1988
- 20 (P.L.556, No.101), known as the Municipal Waste Planning,
- 21 Recycling and Waste Reduction Act, is amended to read:
- 22 Section 511. Site limitation.
- 23 (a) General rule. -- The department shall not issue a permit

- 1 for, nor allow the operation of, a new municipal waste landfill,
- 2 a new commercial residual waste treatment facility or a new
- 3 resource recovery facility within 300 yards of a building which
- 4 is owned by a school district or a parochial school and used for
- 5 instructional purposes, parks or playgrounds existing prior to
- 6 the date the department has received an administratively
- 7 complete application for a permit for such facilities. A new
- 8 <u>municipal waste</u>, <u>residual waste or construction and demolition</u>
- 9 <u>waste landfill may not be permitted to operate within one mile</u>
- 10 of a reservoir that serves as a water source for a community
- 11 water system, as defined in section 3 of the act of May 1, 1984
- 12 (P.L.206, No.43), known as the Pennsylvania Safe Drinking Water
- 13 Act. This subsection shall not affect any modification,
- 14 extension, addition or renewal of existing permitted facilities.

- 16 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
