AN ACT

Amending the act of October 15, 1980 (P.L.950, No.164), entitled "A supplement to the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), 2 entitled 'An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct 3 of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth 4 5 by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, 6 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 10 11 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative officers, and of the several administrative departments, 12 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 14 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 16 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 17 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the 18 number and compensation of the deputies and all other 19 assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 20 21 commissions shall be determined, 'implementing the addition 22 of section 4.1 to Article IV of the Constitution of Pennsylvania; establishing the Office of Attorney General 23 24 elected by the citizens and setting forth powers and duties 25 of the Attorney General; creating an Office of General Counsel and providing for legal services for Commonwealth 26 agencies; transferring, reorganizing or reconstituting 27 certain boards, commissions and agencies; placing certain 28 duties upon the courts and district attorneys; repealing 29 certain acts and parts of acts and making appropriations," in 30 31 Office of Attorney General, further providing for legal 32 advice and civil matters.

- 5 Section 204. Legal advice and civil matters.

- 7 (c) Civil litigation; collection of debts.--
- 8 <u>(1)</u> The Attorney General shall represent the
- 9 Commonwealth and all Commonwealth agencies and upon request,
- 10 the Departments of Auditor General and State Treasury and the
- 11 Public Utility Commission in any action brought by or against
- the Commonwealth or its agencies, and may intervene in any
- other action, including those involving charitable bequests
- and trusts or the constitutionality of any statute. The
- 15 Attorney General shall represent the Commonwealth and its
- 16 citizens in any action brought for violation of the antitrust
- 17 laws of the United States and the Commonwealth.
- 18 <u>(2)</u> The Attorney General shall collect, by suit or
- otherwise, all debts, taxes and accounts due the Commonwealth
- which shall be referred to and placed with the Attorney
- 21 General for collection by any Commonwealth agency; the
- 22 Attorney General shall keep a proper docket or dockets, duly
- 23 indexed, of all such claims, showing whether they are in
- 24 litigation and their nature and condition.
- 25 (3) The Attorney General may, upon determining that it
- is more efficient or otherwise is in the best interest of the
- Commonwealth, authorize the General Counsel or the counsel
- for an independent agency to initiate, conduct or defend any
- 29 particular litigation or category of litigation in his stead.
- 30 <u>(4)</u> The Attorney General shall approve all settlements

- 1 over such maximum amounts as he shall determine arising out
- of claims brought against the Commonwealth pursuant to 42
- 3 Pa.C.S. § 5110.
- 4 (5) In carrying out the powers and duties under this
- 5 <u>subsection</u>, the Attorney General may not enter into a
- 6 <u>contingency fee agreement with a private attorney for</u>
- 7 representation of the Commonwealth, a Commonwealth agency or
- 8 <u>the Office of Attorney General in any civil action or</u>
- 9 <u>litigation</u>.

- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
