- 11 (1) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 12 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this

- 15 "Insurer." A foreign or domestic insurance company,
- 16 association or exchange holding a certificate of authority under
- 17 the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The
- 18 Insurance Company Law of 1921; a risk-assuming preferred

- 1 provider organization operating under section 630 of The
- 2 Insurance Company Law of 1921; a health maintenance organization
- 3 holding a certificate of authority under the act of December 29,
- 4 1972 (P.L.1701, No.364), known as the Health Maintenance
- 5 Organization Act; a fraternal benefit society holding a
- 6 certificate of authority under the former act of December 14,
- 7 1992 (P.L.835, No.134), known as the Fraternal Benefit Societies
- 8 Code; a hospital plan corporation holding a certificate of
- 9 authority under 40 Pa.C.S. Ch. 61 (relating to hospital plan
- 10 corporations); a professional health service plan corporation
- 11 holding a certificate of authority under 40 Pa.C.S. Ch. 63
- 12 (relating to professional health services plan corporations); an
- 13 entity providing medical support plans which qualify as
- 14 <u>insurance under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act</u>
- 15 (Public Law 111-148, 124 Stat. 119), regardless of whether or
- 16 not the medical support plans are regulated by the Insurance
- 17 <u>Department;</u> or a similar entity authorized to do insurance
- 18 business in this Commonwealth.

- 20 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
