- 12 "Commission." The Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and
- 13 <u>Delinquency</u>.
- 14 "Eligible applicant." A municipality located within this
- 15 Commonwealth that has not received a grant from the program in
- 16 the previous five years.
- 17 "Fund." The Safe Communities Grant Program Fund established

- 27 <u>§ 5902. Grant program.</u>
- 28 (a) Establishment.--The Safe Communities Grant Program is
- 29 established as a competitive grant program within the
- 30 <u>commission</u>.
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1	(B) DEPOSITSMONEY APPROPRIATED TO THE FUND BY THE GENERAL <
2	ASSEMBLY SHALL BE DEPOSITED INTO THE FUND.
3	(b) (C) PurposeThe purpose of the program is to award <
4	grants to improve public health and safety around this
5	Commonwealth through the installation and maintenance of
6	lighting or security cameras, or both, in and around high crime
7	areas, as determined by the commission, with priority to be
8	given to schools, playgrounds and recreation and senior centers.
9	(C) AdministrationThe commission shall administer the <
10	program.
11	(d) (E) Public noticeThe commission shall provide <
12	information regarding the availability and award of program
13	grant money on the commission's publicly accessible Internet
14	website.
15	<u>§ 5903. Safe Communities Grant Program Fund.</u>
16	(a) EstablishmentThe Safe Communities Grant Program Fund
17	is established in the State Treasury.
18	(b) AppropriationAll money deposited into the fund and
19	interest earned on the money in the fund are appropriated to the
20	commission on a continuing basis to award grants under this
21	<u>chapter.</u>
22	<u>§ 5904. Applications.</u>
23	(a) FormsThe commission shall develop annual grant
24	application forms for any eligible applicants that seek a
25	program grant. At a minimum, the forms shall contain the
26	following information:
27	(1) The name, address and contact information of the
28	municipality.
29	(2) The amount of program grant money requested.
30	(3) The proposed use for the requested program grant
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1	<u>money.</u>

2	(4) If applicable, a detailed plan describing the
3	monitoring of any security cameras installed with money from
4	the program.
5	(5) If applicable, a detailed maintenance plan for any
6	lighting installed with money from the program.
7	(6) Any other information that the commission deems
8	necessary and appropriate.
9	(b) Application periodBeginning no later than 180 days
10	after the effective date of this section, the commission shall
11	begin accepting and processing applications. For all subsequent
12	years, the commission shall establish an application period
13	during which applications for grants under this chapter are
14	accepted.
15	<u>§ 5905. Award of program grants.</u>
16	(a) ReviewAfter review of the information provided under
17	each applicant's submitted application form, the commission
18	shall determine whether to award grant program money to the
19	applicant and, if so, the amount of the program grant money
20	awarded.
21	(b) AllocationThe commission may not award a grant in
22	excess of \$25,000 nor provide grants in excess of the amount in
23	<u>the fund.</u>
24	(c) Competitive nature of awardsProgram grants shall be
25	awarded on a competitive basis to eligible applicants. In
26	awarding program grants, the commission shall:
27	(1) Give preference to applicants whose grant proposals
28	demonstrate the greatest likelihood of reducing the number of
29	persons victimized by gun violence in their community.
30	(2) Consider the scope of the applicant's proposal and

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1	the applicant's demonstrated need for additional resources to
2	effectively reduce gun violence in the affected municipality.
3	<u>(d) Time periods</u>
4	(1) The commission shall approve or deny an application
5	no later than 60 days after the receipt of the application.
6	(2) If the commission fails to approve or deny within 60
7	days after the receipt of the application, the application
8	shall be deemed denied.
9	(e) Notice
10	(1) The commission shall provide written notice to the
11	applicant of the award or denial of the program grant money.
12	(2) Notice of the award of program grant money shall
13	include the amount of the program grant money awarded and any
14	conditions or restrictions on the use of the program grant
15	money.
16	(3) Notice of the denial of all or part of the program
17	grant money requested shall include the reasons for the full
18	<u>or partial denial.</u>
19	<u>§ 5906. Reports.</u>
20	No less than every three years, the commission shall prepare
21	and submit a report to the General Assembly regarding the rate
22	of gun violence in municipalities that received grants from the
23	program.
24	Section 4 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days. <

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
