## AN ACT

6	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. Title 35 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
9	Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

- 2 § 52B01. Scope of chapter.
- 3 This chapter relates to school-based substance abuse
- 4 prevention and intervention.
- 5 § 52B02. Definitions.
- 6 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 7 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 8 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 9 "Controlled substance." The term shall have the meaning
- 10 given to it under section 2 of the act of April 14, 1972
- 11 (P.L.233, No.64), known as The Controlled Substance, Drug,
- 12 Device and Cosmetic Act.
- 13 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 14 Commonwealth.
- 15 "Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs." The department
- 16 established in accordance with Article XXIII-A of the act of
- 17 April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative
- 18 Code of 1929, or any successor agency or office of the
- 19 Commonwealth created on or after the effective date of this act
- 20 to assume the powers and duties of the Department of Drug and
- 21 Alcohol Programs.
- 22 "Drug." The term shall have the meaning given to it under
- 23 section 2 of The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic
- 24 Act.
- 25 "Prescription drug." A controlled substance or any other
- 26 drug which requires a medical prescription to be dispensed to or
- 27 for an ultimate user.
- 28 "Program." The School-Based Substance Abuse Prevention and
- 29 Intervention Program established under this chapter.
- 30 "School." A public school, including a charter school, cyber

- 1 charter school, intermediate unit or area vocational-technical
- 2 school, operating in a school district within this Commonwealth.
- 3 <u>"School district." School districts of all classifications</u>
- 4 <u>established pursuant to section 202 of the act of March 10, 1949</u>
- 5 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949.
- 6 <u>"Student." An individual enrolled in a school district,</u>
- 7 <u>including an individual enrolled in a charter or cyber charter</u>
- 8 <u>school in any school district in this Commonwealth.</u>
- 9 § 52B03. Establishment of program.
- 10 (a) Establishment. -- There is established the School-Based
- 11 <u>Substance Abuse Prevention and Intervention Program within the</u>
- 12 <u>Department of Education.</u>
- 13 <u>(b) Duties of the department.--The department, in</u>
- 14 consultation with the Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs,
- 15 <u>shall establish curriculum guidelines to govern the development</u>
- 16 and implementation of an effective age-appropriate, school-based
- 17 program of instruction in substance abuse prevention and
- 18 intervention in accordance with the requirements of this act.
- 19 (c) Guidelines. -- The curriculum guidelines shall be designed
- 20 to include the following elements, where age-appropriate, in
- 21 health courses of instruction:
- 22 (1) Detailed factual information regarding the risk of
- 23 <u>harm associated with the use of controlled substances and the</u>
- 24 nonmedical use of prescription drugs, including the
- 25 physiological, psychological, sociological, financial and
- 26 criminal consequences and other aspects of controlled
- 27 <u>substance and prescription drug misuse and abuse.</u>
- 28 (2) Detailed information regarding the availability of
- 29 counseling and other support services and assistance for
- 30 students and their families with controlled substance or

- 1 prescription drug addiction or dependency problems.
- 2 (3) Knowledge and skills needed to evaluate
- 3 advertisements for and media portrayals of prescription
- 4 <u>drugs</u>, including the marketing of prescription drugs.
- 5 (4) Detailed instruction on the need for and the role of
- 6 <u>law enforcement in controlling unlawful possession and use of</u>
- 7 <u>controlled substances and prescription drugs and law-abiding</u>
- 8 <u>behavior</u>, including interaction with members of the law
- 9 enforcement and criminal justice communities.
- 10 (5) Detailed information on population-specific risk
- 11 <u>factors such as age, gender, culture, ethnicity, environment</u>
- 12 <u>and substance-abusing peers.</u>
- 13 <u>(6) Detailed information on all forms of substance</u>
- abuse, alone or in combination, including the underage use of
- 15 <u>illegal controlled substances and the inappropriate use of</u>
- prescription drugs and other legally obtained drugs.
- 17 (7) Comprehensive instruction on Federal law and the
- 18 laws of this Commonwealth related to the possession, sale and
- 19 use of controlled substances and illegally obtained
- 20 prescription drugs.
- 21 (c) Development of plan. -- No later than 180 days after the
- 22 <u>effective date of this subsection</u>, the department shall
- 23 recommend to the General Assembly a plan to assist each school
- 24 district with the establishment and maintenance of a program
- 25 that will provide appropriate counseling and support services to
- 26 students who experience problems related to the misuse and abuse
- 27 of controlled substances and prescription drugs or any other
- 28 drug or substance which has a potential for misuse or abuse. A
- 29 <u>school district may integrate counseling and support services</u>
- 30 provided under this subsection into any student assistance

- 1 program established and maintained by such school district under
- 2 section 1547 of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 3 as the Public School Code of 1949.
- 4 § 52B04. Duties of school districts.
- 5 (a) Initial instructions.--
- 6 (1) Beginning with the 2018-2019 school year or at the
- 7 <u>beginning of the first full school year following the</u>
- 8 <u>effective date of this subsection</u>, whichever is earlier, and
- 9 <u>each school year thereafter, each student shall receive</u>
- 10 mandatory instruction in the program established under
- 11 <u>section 52B03(a) (relating to establishment of program) in</u>
- 12 <u>every school year and in every grade from kindergarten</u>
- 13 <u>through grade 12. The instruction shall be integrated within</u>
- 14 the health course of study required in accordance with the
- 15 State Board of Education regulations. In grades where health
- is offered, instruction may also be integrated into other
- 17 appropriate courses of study. In grades where health is not
- 18 offered, instruction shall be integrated into an appropriate
- 19 curriculum requirement in accordance with the requirements of
- 20 <u>22 Pa. Code (relating to education).</u>
- 21 (2) The instruction required to be provided in
- 22 <u>accordance with paragraph (1) shall:</u>
- 23 <u>(i) Be age appropriate.</u>
- 24 (ii) Be sequential in method of study.
- 25 (iii) Discourage the use of controlled substances
- and the misuse and abuse of prescription drugs, including
- 27 <u>prescription drugs that have a heightened potential for</u>
- addiction or dependency.
- 29 (iv) Communicate that the sale, possession and use
- of controlled substances is a violation of law subject to

1	criminal prosecution and may result in addiction.
2	(v) Communicate that the unlawful possession, sale
3	or give away and the improper or unauthorized use of
4	legally obtained prescription drugs are violations of
5	law, which may be subject to criminal prosecution.
6	(vi) Include instruction in prescription drug misuse
7	and abuse, including information on the connection
8	between prescription drug misuse and abuse and addiction
9	to controlled substances, such as heroin, and the
10	likelihood of accidental overdose.
11	(vii) Include prevention strategies designed to
12	prevent early experimentation and abuse of controlled
13	substances and prescription drugs.
14	(viii) Communicate information on the physical and
15	mental harms associated with the use of designer drugs,
16	anabolic steroids and other such drugs, substances and
17	supplements.
18	(3) School districts may utilize any appropriate public
19	or private materials, personnel and other resources in
20	developing and implementing the program. The Department of
21	Drug and Alcohol Programs shall make available information
22	about appropriate curriculum materials upon request of a
23	school district or charter school. In developing its program,
24	each school district shall consult with the single county
25	authority designated by the Department of Drug and Alcohol
26	Programs to provide drug and alcohol services in the school
27	district's area.
28	(b) Additional authority Each school district is
29	authorized to and may develop and offer programs relating to
30	controlled substances and prescription drugs for parents of

- 1 students enrolled in the public schools in the school district.
- 2 <u>If a school district develops the programs, they shall be</u>
- 3 <u>developed in consultation with the single county authority</u>
- 4 <u>designated by the Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs to</u>
- 5 provide drug and alcohol services in the school district's area.
- 6 The program shall be offered at no cost to parents.
- 7 (c) In-service training. -- Beginning with the first full
- 8 school year following the effective date of this subsection and
- 9 <u>each school year thereafter, the department, in consultation</u>
- 10 with the Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs, shall make
- 11 available to all school districts and intermediate units in-
- 12 service training programs based upon the curriculum quidelines
- 13 established under section 52B03 and the instruction requirements
- 14 <u>established under this section. The in-service training program</u>
- 15 shall include information necessary to prepare for the required
- 16 instruction in the misuse and abuse of controlled substances and
- 17 prescription drugs, including opioid analgesics and other
- 18 controlled substances approved for medical use which have a
- 19 <u>heightened potential for misuse and abuse.</u> The in-service
- 20 programs may utilize the single county authorities designated by
- 21 the Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs or other
- 22 institutions, agencies or persons as the department may deem
- 23 appropriate.
- 24 (d) Training programs for instructors. -- As part of the in-
- 25 service training under subsection (c), each school district
- 26 shall provide training programs on controlled substance and
- 27 prescription drug misuse and abuse for all instructors whose
- 28 teaching responsibilities include courses of study in which
- 29 instruction concerning controlled substance and prescription
- 30 drug misuse and abuse is integrated. To comply with this

- 1 requirement, a school district may utilize programs that may be
- 2 <u>made available by the department, the Department of Drug and</u>
- 3 Alcohol Programs or any other alternative programs as may be
- 4 approved by the department, in consultation with the Department
- 5 of Drug and Alcohol Programs.
- 6 (e) Nonpublic schools. -- The governing board of each
- 7 <u>intermediate unit in which a nonpublic school is located shall</u>
- 8 have the authority and the duty to loan to all students
- 9 <u>attending nonpublic schools within the intermediate unit all</u>
- 10 educational materials developed by either the department or the
- 11 Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs under this chapter for
- 12 the instruction of public school students on the nature and
- 13 <u>effects of controlled substances and prescription drugs and the</u>
- 14 misuse and abuse of controlled substances and prescription
- 15 drugs. A board of school directors shall not be obligated to
- 16 expend funds which are not provided by either the Federal or
- 17 State Government for drug education programs for the use or loan
- 18 of materials to a nonpublic school. A nonpublic school may
- 19 <u>utilize the in-service training programs made available by the</u>
- 20 <u>department through the intermediate unit.</u>
- 21 § 52B05. Construction.
- Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to prohibit a
- 23 school district from integrating a school-based substance abuse
- 24 prevention and intervention curriculum of instruction in
- 25 accordance with the requirements of this chapter into its
- 26 current curriculum requirements for instruction of alcohol,
- 27 <u>chemical and tobacco abuse in accordance with section 1547 of</u>
- 28 the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public
- 29 School Code of 1949.
- 30 § 52B06. Regulations.

- 1 The department may adopt and promulgate regulations necessary
- 2 to carry out and enforce the provisions of this chapter.
- 3 Section 2. This act shall take effect as follows:
- 4 (1) The addition of 35 Pa.C.S. § 52B03 shall take effect 5 immediately.
- 6 (2) This section shall take effect immediately.
- 7 (3) The remainder of this act shall take effect 180 days 8 following the publication of the curriculum guidelines in the 9 Pennsylvania Bulletin.
