AN ACT

Amending Title 65 (Public Officers) of the Pennsylvania 1 Consolidated Statutes, in ethics standards and financial 2 disclosure, further providing for definitions, providing for 3 gift ban and for gift ban exceptions and further providing for statement of financial interests. 5 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. The definition of "person" in section 1102 of 8 Title 65 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended and the section is amended by adding definitions to read: 10 11 § 1102. Definitions. 12 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter 13 shall have, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the 14 meanings given to them in this section: 15 16 "Cash." United States currency and coin and foreign currency 17 and coin. * * * 18

"Lobbyist." As defined in section 13A03 (relating to

- 3 "Person." A business, governmental body, individual,
- 4 <u>including an individual lobbyist or employee of a lobbyist</u>,
- 5 corporation, union, association, firm, partnership, committee,
- 6 club or other organization or group of persons.

- 8 Section 2. Title 65 is amended by adding sections to read:
- 9 <u>§ 1103.1. Gift ban.</u>
- 10 Except as provided in section 1103.2 (relating to gift ban
- 11 <u>exceptions</u>), no public official, public employee or nominee or
- 12 candidate for public office may receive, accept, take, seek or
- 13 solicit any of the following:
- 14 (1) Gifts, other than gifts of cash, having either an
- 15 <u>aggregate fair market value or aggregate actual cost greater</u>
- than \$50 from any one person in a calendar year.
- 17 (2) Hospitality, transportation or lodging having either
- 18 <u>an aggregate fair market value or aggregate actual cost</u>
- 19 greater than \$500 from any one person in a calendar year.
- 20 (3) A gift of cash.
- 21 § 1103.2. Gift ban exceptions.
- 22 The prohibitions listed in section 1103.1 (relating to gift
- 23 ban) shall not apply to any of the following:
- 24 (1) A gift or any hospitality, transportation or lodging

22	(2) A "contribution," as defined in section 1621 of the
23	act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the
24	Pennsylvania Election Code, lawfully made under that act.
25	(3) Informational material sent to the office of a
26	public official or public employee in the form of a book,
27	article, periodical, other written material, audiotape,
28	videotape or other forms of communication for
29	nonentertainment purposes.
30	(4) An award or prize given to competitors in a contest

of event open to the public, including landom drawings.
(5) An honorary degree or award and associated travel,
food, refreshments and entertainment provided in the
presentation of the degree or award.
(6) Training provided to a public official or public
employee if the training is in the interest of a governmental
entity. This paragraph shall include food and refreshments
furnished to all attendees as an integral part of the
training.
(7) Food and beverage for consumption at any of the
<pre>following:</pre>
(i) A public event, including a public meeting.
(ii) An event directly related to the duties and
responsibilities of a public official or public employee.
(iii) An event where a public official or public
employee is a speaker or a member of a panel.
(iv) A regularly scheduled event sponsored by a
constituent, Statewide organization or nonprofit
organization.
(8) Gifts exchanged between public officials or public
employees and their staffs on a voluntary basis.
(9) An educational mission, including a meeting with
governmental officials, either foreign or domestic, intended
to educate a public official or public employee on matters of
public policy, to which the public official or public
employee may be invited to participate along with other
Federal, State or local public officials or community
<pre>leaders.</pre>
(10) Anything paid for by a Federal, State or other
government or governmental entity under a government

2	(11) An honorarium, including an award, plaque, trophy
3	or other item, valued at \$100 or less that is substantially
4	commemorative in nature.
5	(12) Tokens having de minimis economic impact, such as a
6	greeting card, pen, cap or t-shirt.
7	(13) Light food or refreshments, such as hors d'oeuvres,
8	in a group setting and intended for mass consumption and not
9	intended for consumption by a specific individual.
10	(14) Complimentary attendance and food or beverage at a
11	bona fide charitable or political event.
12	(15) The following:
13	(i) Reimbursement of hospitality, transportation or
14	<pre>lodging expenses by:</pre>
15	(A) A governmental body.
16	(B) An organization or association of public
17	officials or employees of political subdivisions,
18	which a public official or public employee serves in
19	an official capacity.
20	(C) A private foundation as defined under
21	section 509 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986
22	(Public Law 99-514, 26 U.S.C. § 1 et seq.).
23	(D) An organization exempt from taxes under
