6	Section 1. Title 53 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated

10	(a) Ballistic armor required Except as provided under	<
11	subsection (b), the THE commission shall require a law	<
12	enforcement officer AGENCY, in collaboration with any applicable	_<
13	State or local agency, to be equipped with ballistic armor THAT	<
14	MAY BE USED BY LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS while engaging in	
15	criminal or traffic law enforcement duties. The ballistic armor	
16	shall meet all of the following criteria:	
17	(1) The ballistic armor shall be TYPE II, Type IIIA,	<
18	Type III or Type IV on the effective date of this section.	

1	(2) The ballistic armor shall be certified by the
2	National Institute of Justice within the United States
3	Department of Justice on the effective date of this section.
4	(3) The ballistic armor shall not be expired.
5	(b) Exception. A law enforcement officer employed to check <
6	parking meters or to perform only administrative duties and
7	auxiliary and fire police shall be exempt from the ballistic
8	armor requirement under subsection (a).
9	(c) (B) Training The commission shall provide training to <
10	a law enforcement officer on the proper use of ballistic armor,
11	the different classifications of ballistic armor provided by the
12	National Institute of Justice within the United States
13	Department of Justice and when a law enforcement officer should
14	wear additional ballistic armor.
15	(d) Definition. As used in this section, the term "law_

13	(C) DEFINITIONAS USED IN THIS SECTION, THE TERM "LAW <
14	ENFORCEMENT OFFICER" SHALL HAVE THE SAME MEANING AS THE TERM
15	"PEACE OFFICER" UNDER 18 PA.C.S. § 501 (RELATING TO DEFINITIONS)
16	AND SHALL ALSO INCLUDE CAMPUS POLICE OFFICERS OF ANY PRIVATE OR
17	PUBLIC COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY.
18	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
