## AN ACT

Amending the act of May 3, 1933 (P.L.242, No.86), entitled "An act to promote the public health and safety by providing for 2 examination, licensing and granting of permits for those who 3 desire to engage in the profession of cosmetology; defining cosmetology, and regulating cosmetology salons, schools, 5 students, apprentices, teachers, managers, manicurists and 6 cosmetologists; conferring powers and duties upon the Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs in the 7 8 Department of State; providing for appeals to certain courts 9 10 by applicants and licensees; and providing penalties," further providing for definitions, for practice without 11 license prohibited, for eligibility requirements for 12 examination, for limited licenses, for requirements of a 13 school of cosmetology, for practice in licensed salons only, 14 for booth rental prohibited, for fees, for duration and 15 renewal of licenses and for penalties. 16 17 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 18 hereby enacts as follows: 19 Section 1. The definitions of "cosmetology" and "limited 20 license" in section 1 of the act of May 3, 1933 (P.L.242, 21 No.86), referred to as the Cosmetology Law, are amended and the 22 section is amended by adding definitions to read: 23 Section 1. Definitions. -- The following words and phrases 24 when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in

this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

- 2 "Cosmetology" includes any or all work done for compensation
- 3 by any person, which work is generally and usually performed by
- 4 cosmetologists, which work is for the embellishment, cleanliness
- 5 and beautification of the human hair, such as arranging,
- 6 braiding, dressing, curling, waving, permanent waving,
- 7 cleansing, cutting, singeing, bleaching, coloring, pressing, or
- 8 similar work thereon and thereabout, and the removal of
- 9 superfluous hair, and the massaging, cleansing, stimulating,
- 10 manipulating, exercising, or similar work upon the scalp, face,
- 11 arms or hands, or the upper part of the body, by the use of
- 12 mechanical or electrical apparatus or appliances or cosmetics,
- 13 preparations, tonics, antiseptics, creams or lotions, or by any
- 14 other means, and of manicuring the nails, which enumerated
- 15 practices shall be inclusive of the term cosmetology but not in
- 16 limitation thereof. The term also includes the acts comprising
- 17 the practice of nail technology, natural hair braiding [and],
- 18 esthetics and electrology.

- 20 "Electrologist" means an individual licensed by the State
- 21 Board of Cosmetology to practice electrology.
- 22 <u>"Electrology" means the permanent removal of hair through the</u>
- 23 utilization of sterile needle/solid probe electrode-type
- 24 epilation, including thermolysis or electrolysis or a
- 25 <u>combination</u> of both.

- 27 "Limited license" means a license issued by the State Board
- 28 of Cosmetology to an individual which permits that individual to
- 29 engage in the practice of esthetics, natural hair braiding [or],
- 30 nail technology or electrology.

- 2 Section 2. Sections 2 and 4(c) and (d) of the act are
- 3 amended to read:
- 4 Section 2. Practice without License Prohibited.--It shall be
- 5 unlawful for any person to do any of the following without
- 6 having first obtained from the department a license or limited
- 7 license as provided in this act:
- 8 (1) To practice or teach cosmetology for compensation, or to
- 9 use or maintain any place for the practice of cosmetology for
- 10 compensation, or to use or maintain any place for the teaching
- 11 of cosmetology.
- 12 (2) To practice or teach esthetics, natural hair braiding
- 13 [or] nail technology or electrology for compensation or to use
- 14 or maintain any place for the practice of esthetics, natural
- 15 hair braiding [or], nail technology or electrology for
- 16 compensation.
- 17 Section 4. Eligibility Requirements for Examination. -- \* \* \*
- 18 (c) No person shall be permitted to receive a license to
- 19 teach cosmetology or natural hair braiding, nail technology
- 20 [or] \_ esthetics or electrology unless such person shall have a
- 21 license to practice cosmetology or a limited license, be at
- 22 least eighteen years of age, shall have completed a twelfth
- 23 grade education or the equivalent thereof and have had five
- 24 hundred hours of specialized training as set forth in section 6
- 25 of this act which hours shall be in addition to the hours
- 26 necessary to qualify for a license to practice cosmetology or a
- 27 limited license.
- 28 (d) An applicant for a license to teach cosmetology, natural
- 29 hair braiding, nail technology [or], esthetics or electrology
- 30 shall be permitted to take a written examination upon completion

- 1 of at least four hundred hours of the specialized training
- 2 required. The examination shall include both theoretical and
- 3 procedural skill questions as prescribed by the board. Any
- 4 applicant may apply and is eligible for licensure upon (1)
- 5 passing the written examination, (2) completion of the required
- 6 five hundred hours of instruction, and (3) certification by a
- 7 duly licensed school of satisfactory completion of all program
- 8 requirements.
- 9 Section 3. Section 5(b) of the act is amended by adding a
- 10 paragraph to read:
- 11 Section 5. Limited Licenses.--\* \* \*
- 12 (b) The board shall issue the following limited licenses to
- 13 qualified applicants:
- 14 \* \* \*
- 15 (4) (i) Electrologist license, which shall only authorize
- 16 the holder to engage in the practice of electrology. An
- 17 applicant for an electrologist license shall have completed four
- 18 <u>hundred hours of instruction in electrology in a licensed school</u>
- 19 of cosmetology and passed an examination limited to that
- 20 practice. Licensed electrologists may operate a salon limited to
- 21 that license. An applicant may be permitted to take a written
- 22 <u>examination upon completion of at least three hundred fifty</u>
- 23 hours of instruction in electrology in a licensed school of
- 24 cosmetology. The examination shall include both theoretical and
- 25 procedural skill questions as prescribed by the board. Any
- 26 applicant may apply and is eliqible for licensure upon (A)
- 27 passing the written examination, (B) completion of the required
- 28 <u>four hundred hours of board-approved subjects</u>, and (C)
- 29 certification by a duly licensed school of satisfactory
- 30 completion of all program requirements.

- 1 (ii) The requirements of subparagraph (i) shall not apply
- 2 and a license to practice electrology shall be issued to an
- 3 <u>applicant who:</u>
- 4 (A) has submitted an application, along with the required
- 5 fee, within one year of the board's promulgation of final
- 6 regulations required under this section; and
- 7 (B) can demonstrate proof of practice of electrology for
- 8 three consecutive years immediately prior to the date of
- 9 application for licensure. Proof of practice shall require tax
- 10 records of employment and an affidavit from the applicant and
- 11 the applicant's immediate supervisor, where applicable. The
- 12 board shall accept the information provided without penalty to
- 13 the applicant for failure to comply with licensing provisions
- 14 prior to the effective date of this paragraph.

- 16 Section 4. Sections 6(b.1) and (d), 8, 8.1, 16(a), 19(b) and
- 17 20(c.2) and (e) of the act are amended to read:
- 18 Section 6. Requirements of a School of Cosmetology. --\* \* \*
- 19 (b.1) No school of cosmetology shall be granted a license or
- 20 renewal of a license unless it shall require:
- 21 (1) A day school term of training of not less than one
- 22 thousand two hundred fifty hours within a period of not less
- 23 than eight consecutive months or a night school term of training
- 24 for a period of not less than fifteen consecutive months for a
- 25 complete course, comprising all or a majority of the practices
- 26 of cosmetology, as provided by this act. The hours of training
- 27 required by this paragraph shall be accomplished within four
- 28 consecutive years.
- 29 (2) Practical demonstrations and theoretical studies, and
- 30 study in sanitation, sterilization and the use of antiseptics,

- 1 cosmetics and electrical appliances consistent with the
- 2 practical and theoretical requirements as applicable to
- 3 cosmetology, nail technology, natural hair braiding [or],
- 4 esthetics or electrology or any act or practice comprising
- 5 cosmetology, nail technology, natural hair braiding [or],
- 6 esthetics or electrology.
- 7 (3) A ratio of not less than one teacher for every twenty-
- 8 five students.
- 9 (4) A separate curriculum of five hundred hours for
- 10 individuals seeking to become teachers of cosmetology, nail
- 11 technology [or], natural hair braiding or electrology. The
- 12 curriculum shall include methods of teaching and principles of
- 13 education. This paragraph shall not apply to teachers in public
- 14 school programs of cosmetology who meet the standards
- 15 established by the Department of Education for vocational
- 16 education teachers in the public schools, and those teachers
- 17 shall be deemed to have satisfied the educational requirements
- 18 of this paragraph.

- 20 (d) A school of cosmetology which offers a curriculum for
- 21 the practice of natural hair braiding, nail technology [or],
- 22 esthetics or electrology shall require the following with
- 23 respect to hours of instruction:
- 24 (1) for natural hair braiding, students shall be required to
- 25 complete a course of study of three hundred hours;
- 26 (2) for nail technology, students shall be required to
- 27 complete a course of study of two hundred hours; [and]
- 28 (3) for esthetics, students shall be required to complete a
- 29 course of study of three hundred hours[.]; and
- 30 (4) for electrology, students shall be required to complete

- 1 <u>a course of study of four hundred hours.</u>
- 2 Section 8. Practice in Licensed Salons Only. -- (a) Except as
- 3 set forth in subsection (b), it shall be unlawful for any
- 4 person:
- 5 (1) to practice cosmetology for pay in any place other than
- 6 a licensed cosmetology salon or barber shop as defined in the
- 7 act of June 19, 1931 (P.L.589, No.202), referred to as the
- 8 Barbers' License Law; or
- 9 (2) to practice esthetics, nail technology [or], natural
- 10 hair braiding or electrology for pay in any place other than a
- 11 licensed cosmetology salon or a salon limited to esthetics, nail
- 12 technology [or], natural hair braiding or electrology.
- 13 (b) A licensed cosmetologist or the holder of a limited
- 14 license may furnish treatments to persons in their residences by
- 15 appointment.
- 16 Section 8.1. Booth Rental Prohibited. -- The rental of booth
- 17 space by an owner of a cosmetology salon, or the owner of a
- 18 salon limited to esthetics, nail technology [or], natural hair
- 19 braiding or electrology, to any holder of a license issued under
- 20 this act is unlawful.
- 21 Section 16. Fees. -- (a) The board shall, by regulation, fix
- 22 the following fees: (1) for the issuance of a license, with or
- 23 without examination, for cosmetology salon owners, teachers,
- 24 cosmetologists, nail technicians, nail technology salons,
- 25 estheticians, esthetician salons, natural hair braiders, natural
- 26 hair braiding salons, electrologists, electrology salons,
- 27 students and cosmetology schools;
- 28 (1.1) for registration fee for apprentices; and
- 29 (2) for biennial renewal of cosmetology salon owners, school
- 30 instructors, cosmetologists, nail technicians, estheticians,

- 1 natural hair braiders, <u>electrologists</u>, cosmetology schools, nail
- 2 technology salons, esthetician salons [and], natural hair
- 3 braiding salons and electrology salons.

- 5 Section 19. Duration and Renewal of Licenses.--\* \* \*
- 6 (b) An individual holding a license to practice cosmetology
- 7 or an individual holding a limited license who is not engaged in
- 8 practice shall request the board, in writing, to place his
- 9 license in escrow and thus protect his right to obtain a license
- 10 at any such time within a five-year period if he desires to
- 11 again become engaged in the practice of cosmetology or the
- 12 practice of nail technology, natural hair braiding [or],
- 13 esthetics or electrology.
- 14 \* \* \*
- 15 Section 20. Penalties. -- \* \* \*
- 16 (c.2) In addition to any other civil remedy or criminal
- 17 penalty provided for in this act, the board, by a vote of the
- 18 majority of the maximum number of the authorized membership of
- 19 the board as provided by this act or by a vote of the majority
- 20 of the qualified and confirmed membership or a minimum of five
- 21 members, whichever is greater, may levy a civil penalty of up to
- 22 one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) on any current licensee who
- 23 violates any provisions of this act or on any person who
- 24 practices cosmetology, natural hair braiding, nail technology
- 25 [or] esthetics or electrology without being properly licensed
- 26 to do so under this act. The board shall levy this penalty only
- 27 after affording the accused party the opportunity for a hearing,
- 28 as provided in Title 2 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes
- 29 (relating to administrative law and procedure).

- 1 (e) The owner of any salon employing an unlicensed
- 2 cosmetologist or an unlicensed natural hair braider, nail
- 3 technician [or], esthetician or electrologist shall, upon
- 4 conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding five
- 5 hundred dollars (\$500.00), or to undergo imprisonment not
- 6 exceeding six (6) months, or both, at the discretion of the
- 7 court.
- 8 Section 5. The State Board of Cosmetology shall promulgate
- 9 regulations required to implement this act within 18 months of
- 10 the effective date of this section.
- 11 Section 6. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
