9	Section 1. Section 9801 of Title 51 of the Pennsylvania
10	Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a definition to read:
11	§ 9801. Definitions.
12	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
13	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
14	context clearly indicates otherwise:
15	"Fund." The Keystone State Challenge Academy Fund
16	established under section 9807 (relating to Keystone State
17	Challenge Academy Fund).

19	Section 2. Sections 9806, 9807, 9810 and 9811 of Title 51,

1 added June 28, 2018 (P.L.365, No.51), are amended to read: 2 § 9806. Administration.

3 <u>(a) Staffing.--</u>Subject to 32 U.S.C. § 509 (relating to 4 National Guard Youth Challenge Program of opportunities for 5 civilian youth) and its implementing regulations and applicable 6 agreements, the program shall be staffed by the administrative, 7 professional, technical and clerical employees necessary for the 8 operation of the program.

9 (b) Statement of policy.--The department shall adopt a

10 statement of policy for the maintenance and use of the fund

11 within 60 days of the effective date of this subsection. The

12 policy shall be transmitted as a notice to the Legislative

13 <u>Reference Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin</u>

14 but shall not be subject to review under section 205 of the act

15 of July 31, 1968 (P.L.769, No.240), referred to as the

16 Commonwealth Documents Law, sections 204(b) and 301(10) of the

17 act of October 15, 1980 (P.L.950, No.164), known as the

18 Commonwealth Attorneys Act, or the act of June 25, 1982

19 (P.L.633, No.181), known as the Regulatory Review Act.

20 § 9807. [Funding.] <u>Keystone State Challenge Academy Fund.</u>

21 (a) Establishment.--The Keystone State Challenge Academy

22 Fund is established as a special fund in the State Treasury.

23 (b) Appropriation.--All money deposited into the fund and

24 the interest the fund accrues are appropriated to the department

25 on a continuing basis to be used for the purposes provided under

26 this chapter.

27 (c) Use of fund.--The fund may only be used for the purposes

28 provided for under this chapter and no money in the fund may be

29 transferred or diverted to any other purpose by administrative

30 <u>action</u>.

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<u>(d)</u> Sources of money.--Money available to the fund shall
 <u>include appropriations and transfers from the General Fund,</u>
 <u>special funds, Federal funds and other sources of revenue made</u>
 <u>available to the fund.</u>

<u>(e) Allocation.--Money from the fund shall be allocated for</u>
<u>the purposes provided for under this chapter no later than</u>
October 31, 2019, and each October 31 thereafter.

8 (f) Funding.--The department shall apply for funding, as provided for under 32 U.S.C. § 509(d) (relating to National 9 10 Guard Youth Challenge Program of opportunities for civilian youth). Under 32 U.S.C. § 509(j), the department may supplement 11 12 such funding with other resources, including gifts, made 13 available to the department and may also accept, use and dispose 14 of gifts or donations of money, other property or services for 15 the program.

16 § 9810. Report.

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17 [The department shall submit annually to] By July 31, 2020, 18 and each July 31 thereafter, the department shall submit to the 19 chairperson and minority chairperson of the Appropriations 20 Committee of the Senate, the chairperson and minority 21 chairperson of the Education Committee of the Senate, the 22 chairperson and minority chairperson of the Veterans Affairs and 23 Emergency Preparedness Committee of the Senate, the chairperson 24 and minority chairperson of the Appropriations Committee of the 25 House of Representatives, the chairperson and minority 26 chairperson of the Education Committee of the House of Representatives and the chairperson and minority chairperson of 27 28 the Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness Committee of the 29 House of Representatives a written report concerning the program. The report shall include, but not be limited to, all of 30

2 (1)The number of individuals who applied to the program 3 in the previous fiscal year. The number of individuals who participated in the 4 (2)program in the previous fiscal year. 5 6 The number and percentage of program participants in (3) 7 the previous fiscal year who achieved each of the following: 8 (i) Earned a high school diploma or its equivalent. 9 Enrolled in a course of study at an institution (ii) 10 of higher education. 11 (iii) Accepted a position of full-time, paid 12 employment. 13 (iv) Accepted a position of part-time, paid 14 employment. 15 Entered the armed forces of the United States, (V) 16 including a reserve component or the National Guard. 17 The demographic makeup of the applicants to, and (4) 18 participants in, the program, including, but not limited to, 19 the following: 20 (i) Race. 21 (ii) Age. 22 (iii) Gender. 23 (4.1) Details on the revenues and expenditures of the 24 fund in the prior fiscal year and the identification and 25 description of activities, programs and projects which 26 received money from the fund. 27 Any information the department provides to the (5) Secretary of Defense under 32 U.S.C. § 509(k) (relating to 28 29 National Guard Youth Challenge Program of opportunities for 30 civilian youth).

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1 § 9811. Audit required.

The department shall undergo an annual audit of the program. The audit shall be conducted by a qualified [independent] certified public accountant under generally accepted audit standards of the Governmental Accounting Standards Board. The audit shall be submitted to the following:

7 (1) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
8 [Education] <u>Appropriations</u> Committee of the Senate.

9 (1.1) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
 10 Education Committee of the Senate.

(2) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
