AN ACT

1 Requiring carbon monoxide alarms in school buildings.

2 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

3 hereby enacts as follows:

4 Section 1. Short title.

5 This act shall be known and may be cited as the School6 Buildings Carbon Monoxide Alarm Act.

7 Section 2. Definitions.

8 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 9 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 10 context clearly indicates otherwise:

11 "Carbon monoxide alarm." A device to detect and sound an 12 alarm in the presence of carbon monoxide that meets all of the 13 following:

14 (1) Bears the label of a nationally recognized standard
15 testing laboratory indicating that the device is appropriate
16 for its intended use.

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(2) Is installed and maintained in accordance with this

1 act.

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2 Is tested, at least monthly, in accordance with the (3) 3 manufacturer's instructions.

4 "Department." The Department of Education of the Commonwealth. 5

"Fossil fuel." Coal, kerosene, oil, fuel gases or other 6 petroleum or hydrocarbon products that emit carbon monoxide as a 7 byproduct of combustion. 8

"Nonpublic school." Any school, other than a public school, 9 10 in which a resident of this Commonwealth may legally fulfill the 11 compulsory school attendance requirements of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 12 1949, and which meets the requirements of Title VI of the Civil 13 Rights Act of 1964 (Public Law 88-352, 78 Stat. 241). 14 Section 3. Installation of carbon monoxide alarms.

16 (a) Requirement. -- Not later than January 1, 2022, all public 17 and nonpublic elementary and secondary school buildings that contain a fossil-fuel burning furnace, boiler or water heater 18 19 shall be required to install carbon monoxide alarms in 20 accordance with the Standard for the Installation of Carbon 21 Monoxide (CO) Detection and Warning Equipment (NFPA 720) of the 22 National Fire Protection Association, and applicable regulations 23 adopted by the department under subsection (b). Combination 24 smoke and carbon monoxide alarms shall be permitted.

(b) 25 Regulations.--The department shall adopt regulations in consultation with the State Fire Commissioner and State and 26 27 local building code authorities to incorporate the requirements 28 specified in this act. These regulations shall include the appropriate number, type and placement of carbon monoxide alarms 29 30 in school buildings and shall be completed not later than six

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1 months after the effective date of this section.

2 (c) Applicability.--Subsection (a) shall not apply to a
3 public or nonpublic school if the department determines that no
4 potential carbon monoxide hazard exists for the school building.

5 (d) Funding. -- In addition to any State funds specifically 6 appropriated by the General Assembly for the purposes of this act, the department shall apply for Federal, non-State, private 7 and other funds and may accept donations, including donations of 8 equipment, to help public and nonpublic schools comply with the 9 provisions of this act. Funds and equipment collected under this 10 11 subsection shall be distributed to schools in a manner approved 12 by the department. The department may adopt rules as necessary to implement this subsection. 13

14 Section 4. Effective date.

15 This act shall take effect immediately.
