1	<u>(d.1) Internet gamblingNo individual or entity shall</u>
2	solicit, invite, collect or accept cash or any other form of
3	currency through the Internet for the purposes of wagering or
4	betting. No individual or entity shall organize, or cause to be
5	organized, any type of gambling event that is held over the
6	Internet.
7	(e) Penalty
8	(1) Any person who fails to provide records as provided
9	in subsection (d) commits a summary offense.
10	(2) A first offense under subsection (d.1) shall be
11	considered a first offense punishable by a fine of not more
12	<u>than \$300.</u>
13	(3) A second offense under subsection (d.1) shall be
14	considered a summary offense punishable by a fine of not more
15	than \$600 and a term of imprisonment not to exceed three
16	days.
17	(4) A third or subsequent offense under subsection (d.1)
18	shall be considered a third degree misdemeanor.

20	Section 3. This act shall apply to bets and wagers placed on
21	or after the effective date of this section.
22	Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
