## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, in alimony and support, further
- 3 providing for alimony.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 3701(a) and (b)(14) of Title 23 of the
- 7 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended and the section
- 8 is amended by adding a subsection to read:
- 9 § 3701. Alimony.
- 10 (a) General rule. -- [Where] Subject to subsection (a.1),
- 11 where a divorce decree has been entered, the court may allow
- 12 alimony, as it deems reasonable, to either party only if it
- 13 finds that alimony is necessary.
- 14 (a.1) Conviction. -- Except where the court finds that an
- 15 order awarding alimony is necessary to prevent manifest
- 16 <u>injustice</u>, a party who has been convicted of committing a
- 17 personal injury crime against the other party shall not be
- 18 <u>awarded alimony</u>. Any amount of alimony paid by the injured party
- 19 after the commission of the offense but before conviction of the

- 1 other party shall be recoverable by the injured party upon
- 2 petition.
- 3 (b) Factors relevant. -- In determining whether alimony is
- 4 necessary and in determining the nature, amount, duration and
- 5 manner of payment of alimony, the court shall consider all
- 6 relevant factors, including:
- 7 \* \* \*
- 8 (14) [The] <u>Subject to subsection (a.1), the</u> marital
- 9 misconduct of either of the parties during the marriage. The
- 10 marital misconduct of either of the parties from the date of
- final separation shall not be considered by the court in its
- determinations relative to alimony, except that the court
- shall consider the abuse of one party by the other party. As
- 14 used in this paragraph, "abuse" shall have the meaning given
- to it under section 6102 (relating to definitions).

- 17 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
